

#### **Booking Baptisms and Weddings**

To qualify for baptism parents should, live within the parish boundaries or be a regular worshipper at St Thomas's/St Luke's. Parents and Godparents should also be prepared to undertake baptism preparation classes.

Every parishioner has the right to a service in church, followed by a committal.

### Bishop Paul's Easter Letter

### Unity and our resurrection hope

People of a certain age like me may remember a simple hymn that went like this:




We are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord, We are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord, And we pray that our unity may one day be restored And they'll know we are Christians by our love, by our love, Yes they'll know we are Christians by our love.

A key thing that preoccupies any diocesan bishop is how we can sustain unity in our Church. I don't confess this to be anything new. Throughout the long history of the church we have held different, deep, sincere, prayerful and well-thought-through theological positions on a whole range of matters. But disagreement can feel

sharper today, as our social networks and scandal-hungry media lay bare these divisions in an aggressive manner. So we need, for our mutual flourishing, to continue to seek out places of unity and commonality.

The Easter story, the Easter message gives us something to unify around. The story of hope triumphing from the jaws



of despair and defeat. It is the powerful testimony at the heart of our Christian witness, the fulfilment of the promise that God has sent his Son to save the world. This is what lies at the heart of the difference we can make as Christians. It is a basic truth and hope that the world is crying out for. It is the hope we can offer.

And it is the story we want people to know because it points to the Jesus we want them to know. This story of hope is too precious to keep to ourselves, we need to share it, shout it, broadcast it to the

world. That Jesus is alive, that He saves us, that he wants to know us and for us to know him.

I believe we can shout that loudest by re-pledging our commitment to Him. To make a deeper commitment to be a disciple of Christ, a follower who not only keeps the story to themselves but through their love, their actions, their quest for justice they show the world what it is like to how the transformational presence of Jesus in their lives. For the church, Easter can be a time of commitment and recommitment.

At our Chrism Eucharist as many as possible across our diocese gather to reaffirm our baptism vows, and those who are ordained renew the promises of their ordination. In so many churches in our diocese and across the Communion we see faithful people rededicating themselves as Christ's disciples at this time.


Alongside my senior colleagues, I am reflecting and praying on how we can encourage a culture of discipleship, a rule of life in our diocese. This will be something that unites us as difference-making disciples seeking to have more people knowing Jesus, more justice in the world. It is a theme I examined in my Lent Lectures at the cathedral and in my recent speech to our Diocesan Synod. I encouraged us to look afresh at that great focus of unity for the church, which we know as the Lord's Prayer and I have been calling the Disciples' Prayer.

So as we celebrate Easter this year let me encourage you, this day and every day, to join with fellow disciples in prayer. Together with them, together with all disciples in this Diocese of Liverpool and in

this worldwide Church, as our risen Saviour taught us, we are bold to say again: "Our Father..." THEN they'll know we are Christians by our love.

May you have a joyous and blessed Easter.

### Letter from the Vicar

In Bishop Paul's Easter message, he reflects on our unity as disciples who are called to make a difference in the name of Jesus - loving and serving communities that are crying out for the precious hope we already hold in our hearts. Jesus calls us to share this hope boldly and generously. Jesus calls us to 'go'.

Wigan Deanery's vision, Transforming Wigan, is that 10% of people will be on a discipleship journey with Jesus by 2023. In a transformed deanery 20,000 people will be somewhere on a journey with Jesus. Here in Ashton we could conceivably look at the population of our unique part of the deanery and work out how many that will be in our town. It's quite a number of disciples.

A good question that we may ask is, 'how will we know?' The temptation (and maybe expectation) is to think that all of these new disciples will be turning up to existing Sunday services in church buildings. In reality the new disciples will be mainly gathered in new worship communities, probably on different days of the week and in places we may not immediately associate with 'church'.

And the way we will know who is on a discipleship journey with Jesus is that rather than a clicker counting numbers on a Sunday, the answer will be in stories and in testimony of transformed lives. Transformed lives in turn will inspire and lead transformation in community.

The starting point for the 20,000 is the witness of you and I who already know the wonder of the good news of Easter and the promise that it holds. It is far simpler than we think.



### Letter from the Vicar

**Prayer** is a good place to start, praying for specific people, praying for communities and opportunities. **Share** is a helpful next step, the name of Jesus on our lips, our testimony of his difference to our own lives. Being **there** is key, loving time given, encouraging, challenging and serving.

Resurrection Easter hope is not mine to keep, it is mine to give. When the hope of Jesus is known in the most difficult and the most ordinary of lives then the discipleship journeys will have begun. Transformational stories will abound and 20,000 people may be a serious underestimate.



### Eight Births at St Thomas's School

### Wigan and Leigh Carers Centre looking for Volunteer Befrienders & Buddy's



A carer is a person of any age, who looks after a family member, relative, partner, neighbour or friend who needs help due to ill health, old age, disability, drug or alcohol misuse or who has mental health problems. You do not have to live with the person or the only one doing the caring.

Wigan and Leigh Carers Centre (WLCC), based in Fredrick Street, Hindley look to support carers in a number of ways from support and advice to training and social groups. Carers can often feel isolated, low in confidence and in need of a listening ear.

WLCC Befriending & Buddying scheme offers a way to help combat isolation for carers by offering them support, encouragement and a listening ear. This is offered by Volunteer Befrienders & Buddy's who take time to support a carer on a one to one – going for a coffee, a walk, offering companionship and a listening ear, introducing them to activities, meeting in their home to chat or enabling them to take some much needed time for themselves.

We are looking for new Volunteer Befrienders to offer support to carers. If you have a couple of hours a week, are a good listener and have empathy with what carers may face, why not try volunteering with Wigan and Leigh Carers Centre?


### Archbishop urges Britain to 'seize and define the future'

In the Presidential speech at the February General Synod, the Archbishop of Canterbury argued that the current political and social climate is an opportunity for re-imagining the nation's practices, values, aspirations and global role.

The Archbishop said "this could be a time of liberation, of seizing and defining the future, or it could be one in which the present problems seize our national future and define us."

The Archbishop went on to argue that the Church of England can be a part of the answer: "we have a voice and a contribution and a capacity and a reach and above all a Lord who is faithful when we fail and faithful when we flourish.

"How are we going to contribute to the national future? There is before the churches of this land, over the next many years, an extraordinary opportunity to be part of reimagining a new Britain, its practices, values, aspirations and global role. To





In a Nutshell: A spin off is a tricky thing to get right and many have tried with mixed results... but when that spin off is essentially another Batman movie, I guess the task and the end result are easier to nail than your average episode of Joey. One of the greatest things too, is that apart from say the Nolan and Burton ones... this also manages to be one of the purest and best Bat movies to date! It's biggest pleasures and keys to success lie in throwing in even the kitchen sink along so many gags and characters and references to everything that ever was in the world of Batman. Beautifully crafting the tale of Batman as the loner character who only thinks of himself and doesn't really want to settle down and going with that angle is a simple bit of storytelling that works great, the genius stroke lies in expanding on the relationship between Bats and his nemesis The Joker (wonderfully voiced by Zach) and how they truly depend on each other even if they won't admit it, it's genius and hilarious and wonderfully done. This sort of detail in the storytelling is what makes this so special alongside the millions of references and characters that are lovingly referenced and scattered throughout... it makes this such a unique blend of great writing and storytelling with plenty of crazy things throughout to keep it so offbeat and ridiculous too. No spoiling of it's many surprises here that's for sure but it's a treat what exactly is in store. Wonderfully voiced, beautifully realised and just so much fun... this is just every single thing you want it to be! So

But without being too down on it, this is still a action sequel to be admired.... the action is stunning, so beautifully choreographed and packing an almighty punch... it's a blitz of frenetic charm that is extremely enjoyable throughout and definitely an area that matches the first movie for intensity.... it's just that in some of this, the real heart and charm of the story at the heart of the original gets a bit glossed over... the story here is so much more simple and efficient whereas the story of the original had a real heartache and drive that made Keanu have to work that much harder to emote and pull out the stops acting wise.... he's still cool here but he lacks the real emotion of the first at times and it's a shame... but better to not focus too much on that, because this is still a lean and mean action sequel which still have a fun story at it's core that expands the universe established in the first movie and introduces some cool new characters not least a Matrix reunion with Larry Fishburne in a fun cameo.... if you loved the first movie you'll still find plenty to love and you'll be left wanting plenty more too, never a bad thing!
