

Letter from the Vicar

One of the encouragements that has stayed with me from the recent Liverpool Diocesan clergy conference is that as Christians we are simply called to 'pray, to rest and then to do what we can!' Each part of the instruction when carried out obediently draws us closer to God and to the purposes that he intends for our lives. It is a simple instruction that is more difficult to follow than it first seems.

I suspect that for many of us, our Christian life turns the instruction the other way round - we do what we can, we rest (hopefully) and then we pray (possibly). We strive in our own strength, trying on our own to work at our service of God. We wonder then why we are often not being fruitful in our Christian service.

Pray, rest and then do, however, draws us firstly close to God, building our relationship, allowing him to guide and instruct. We may discern. We may be lifted. We may be



guided and empowered for the work ahead. For disciples in churches, here at this time, the main task of our work is our part in Transforming Wigan.

Pray. One of the first, and arguably the most important part of Transforming Wigan is the establishment of an order of prayer. Disciples of Jesus across the Wigan Deanery are committing themselves to pray daily, seeking God's will for God's church. Real transformation as God intends can only happen if we tune in to his will and his plans. Maybe you are called to pray in this way. Rest. Rest of course can mean the sleep or the down time that restores energy. Resting in the Lord (Psalm 37:7), consciously spending time with him, builds relationship and trust. It allows us to hear more clearly from him. In that place of stillness, we may find peace and strength. We may allow time to hear and to discern.

Do what you can. Individuals obeying God's call on their lives. Disciples gathered together as church in new ways. Servants following one vision to share Jesus and make more disciples. Many people doing what they can for God in Wigan Deanery, connected and visible in the community may become a catalyst of great transformation.

If you are stuck this way round – Do, Rest (hopefully), Pray (maybe), try turning it round this week. Come close to God as a first priority - Pray, Rest, Do.

# I am the Good Shepherd (John 10:7-11)



Once again we were blessed with good weather for our annual Messy Church in the vicarage garden as we explored what Jesus meant when he said, 'I am the good shepherd'. The good weather and being outside, did mean that there was much more space than usual for people to relax and enjoy being together which was a bonus.



We started with a sheep hunt with children scattering around the garden retrieving cut out sheep. This gave us an opportunity to tell them something about what a shepherd's role was in those days, with the sheep following the shepherd rather than today's image of a farmer rounding them up.

One of the great things about being outside is that glitter can be spilt everywhere and it really doesn't matter! So, we wrote our names in glitter to remind us that Jesus knows each one of us individually by name. We drew sheep with chalks on the path - none of these sheep were the same - they were unique, just like we are!

Sheep can appear to wander around aimlessly. We put a couple of marbles into a tray with splodges of paint around the outside of a piece of paper and tilted it in all directions to make our messy sheep trail. How often do we wander away from Jesus following our own paths rather than the path that Jesus plans for us?

There were some great collages with rolling hills and sheep made from cotton wool with heads and legs drawn on afterwards. The shepherds were generally close to their sheep with the odd wolf around! Cotton wool circular pads made great sheep fridge magnets with just a few bits and pieces added.



Edible sheep didn't last long with white icing, Smarties eyes and strawberry laces for legs! Cork sheep were definitely not for eating but good fun to make. We also



made sheep coasters using spirals of wool stuck onto a black sheep shape and wall hangings to take home.

Before we had our BBQ we made a sheep pen and talked about how Jesus and that he was the gate. Shepherds in Jesus' time would have often laid across the entrance to the sheep pen as a gate, keeping out anything that was a threat to the sheep.

This is what Jesus promises for us - he wants to look after us and protect us.





The Film Review With Rob Carson



### The Nice Guys (15) Directed by Shane Black

**Stars:** Ryan Gosling, Russell Crowe, Angourie Rice, Margaret Qualley, Matt Bomer, Kim Basinger, and Yaya Da Costa

**In a Nutshell:** I'm not going to conjure up some fancy pants way of starting this review, saying something about ain't action comedies good, or buddy cop movies and how there's not been one in a while... or even invoke Shane Black's last buddy movie Kiss Kiss Bang Bang.... except I will, if you liked that then you are going to love this! Though without a whole heap of the savvy and witty meta nature of that 2005 gem, this is still a fast and very funny and charming buddy action thriller with two terrific performances and a lot to love. Shane Black really conjures up the spirit of the decade of the 1970s during the runtime, with the setting and the scenery and the props and set design just beautifully nailing on and capturing the essence in the air. The big draw though and the main reason to love this movie is the central duo, not least Ryan Gosling who is a bonafide comedy superstar in this... his pratfalls and his squeamish casual manner are an utter delight and he's amazing every second he is on screen.... mixing a softness with a toughness with ease... and he's matched beautifully by a top form turn from Crowe, basically the softer and more charming version of his L.A Confidential character... tough with a soft side and they are both matched by the young Angourie Rice, who is note

perfect as Gosling's savvy daughter who winds up in the action on a regular basis. From it's killer tunes on the soundtrack to it's many moments of savvy hilarity via it's great cast and fab tone... this is a bonafide treat and needs to be seen, simply sit back and enjoy immensely! **Rating: 10/10** 



### Independence Day: Resurgence (12A) Directed by Roland Emmerich


