

Christmas Letter

A friend at Christmas

The majority of Christmas advertisements that I have seen this year have a clear underlying message. In their glossy, VERY expensive, highly produced messages the advertisers are saying that Christmas is about bringing people together, in family or extended family units. That, they say, is the best place to consume the product they offer. Around the table of tempting fare from the grocery retailer they show how Christmas can be complete.



And that's not a bad sentiment in many ways. It is certainly one which the Church can subscribe to. We are about community, coming together around Jesus, learning together, journeying together as we try to understand God's love for us and the world. Obviously, the gift we want is not materialistic but the precious gift of the God who loved the entire world, and came to us as a poor baby.

But among all these happy messages I have a nagging worry about loneliness. Research in 2016 showed that a million older people face a lonely Christmas, isolated from the festivities and dreading the season. Maybe it is the call of the Church this year, of your Church, our Church, to do something about that isolation.

Over the past few weeks I have been encouraging everyone in the churches to "Bring One Friend" - in other words to think who it is that each one of us might invite into the worshipping and serving life of the Church. When I started talking about this, I had in mind the desire to share God's love with more people. That is the heart of Jesus' story, his mission, and his

purpose in life. Jesus, who was born in the relative loneliness of the Bethlehem stable wanted to embrace the whole world and show them the reality of the love of the kingdom of God.

We started talking



about "Bringing One Friend" now because we knew that during Advent and at Christmas the Church is still blessed with many ways in which we can connect with our community. We still provide services and events that chime in with the national mood. But we have a still deeper purpose, as we introduce people to the Lord and to the Kingdom. This year, the Christmas, if we can make a bigger difference in one person's life by "bringing one friend" into the community of church and pointing them in the direction of the Kingdom of God then that will be great.

For our table is not filled with the superficial gifts of the consumer-led Christmas; it is the table made by the carpenter. On it are the symbols and gifts of the carpenter. On it are the reminders of his story that started in the Christmas stable and ended in the bursting out of the Easter tomb. Around it are the people he invites into his story, the friends he chose to bring. It's not an exclusive group - Jesus's table has room for more, for you and me, and - yes! - for the friends we bring.







one tree and along the top half of the centre



of the other tree. Slip the two trees together along the slits. To help the tree to stand firmly, use sticky tape to fasten the parts together where they meet.

Decorate the tree. If you are using it as a card then leave an area free



of decorations so that you can write on it.

Movie Reviews

Thor: Ragnarok (12A) Directed by Taika Waititi

In a Nutshell: With a company like Marvel and the output they've already flung across the world over the last nine years, it's hard to be shocked when a film is awesome or even just absolutely amazing... what can surprise from time to time is just the crazy audacious steps they take into different genres and different styles and just how many bonkers things they can throw at a screen and still predominantly be that great superhero epic you want, even if it's within a crazy insane psychedelic comedy adventure. But yeah, they've done it again... and with one heck of a talent on board steering the ship. Taika Waititi, he of directing the two bewilderingly brilliant comedies What We Do in the Shadows and Hunt for the Wilder people takes the helm and it's every bit as hilarious and demented as you'd want from a Marvel movie directed by Taika while still having the soul and depth and drama that you need to propel the story forward and do the necessary dramatic legwork. As ever, it's brimming with fabulous talent... naturally you have the wonderful Chris Hemsworth as charismatic and fabulous as ever with Tom Hiddleston back as everybody's favorite dubious character Loki and as duplicitous as ever, and Mark Ruffalo is back as Bruce Banner and Hulk join the story and the way it further develops the character of Hulk and Banner without it ever overwhelming the main thrust of the plot is terrific and adds yet more layers to the best portraval of the character by far. Cate Blanchett is naturally a sinister and fabulous delight as the villainous Hela, a new villain with a very interesting back-story and connection to the story. Idris Elba continues to be awesome and underused, whilst Hopkins does what he does in a small role. It goes without saying that Jeff Goldblum is just fabulous as the sinister Grandmaster; Karl Urban adds some inner

drama to what could easily be a one note role and has a ball whilst Tessa Thompson is yet another awesome take no prisoners' female hero role in a franchise filled with such inspiring characters, whilst the director himself steals the whole movie whole as the awesome rock fighter Korg with every single one of his lines being a highlight. Simply put, they've done it again;



utilizing the bonkers tone of Guardians of the Galaxy with its colorful imagery and funky soundtrack and upping the bonkers humor whilst retaining the heart and makes what the whole thing tick. It's a riot!

Such a cult classic, one that infamously failed spectacularly on first release before being embraced as a favorite of many, a slow burn masterpiece (one that took me about five viewings to really embrace it into my top list) and such a definitive film... one that really doesn't scream give me a follow up or seguel. How do you follow up that story and hit gold again? This is the point where I said 'well you do this or you do that' but heck, I don't know how they did it but it worked and this is another mesmerizing masterpiece in many ways, you may notice the 9/10 below and wonder why I call it that but I think maybe it misses the 100% perfection mark but that doesn't stop it being under that banner name of a masterpiece. It's such a hard thing to describe exactly why this hits the mark so well... but my word, it really does. It helps having a director as masterful and with an extraordinary eye as Villeneuve; he makes it really shine with a incredible visual imagination and a really powerful and masterful story. Also not hindering is the terrific Ryan Gosling as the lead, taciturn and strong willed yet vulnerable and innocent... his is a really fantastic turn that really anchors the story and narrative, then you have a terrific support cast all providing interesting points and memorable moments (not least Robin Wright as Goslings' fierce boss, Davis as a mysterious lady and Armas as the female lead with a twist) and then you have Ford, turning in one of his best performances in what winds up being the heart of the narrative. To say too much will damage the surprises and drama of discovering this tale for yourself... and it is really hard to describe just why it does what it does so well, but go with it and you'll never forget it in a hurry. It really is a treat to discover, you could say that I've seen things that vou wouldn't believe...
