

Baptisms

Baptisms are held at St Thomas Church at 12.45 on the 2nd & 4th Sundays. Baptisms at St Luke's are at 11 am on the 3rd Sunday.

To qualify for baptism parents should live within the parish boundaries or be a regular worshipper at St Thomas's/St Luke's. Parents and Godparents should also be prepared to undertake baptism preparation classes.

Funerals

Every parishioner has the right to a service in church, followed by a committal.



Letter from the Vicar

It was Bishop Cyril who introduced me to The Methodist Church's covenant prayer. A covenant is an agreement or a contract, a pledge or a promise. At the end of a gathering of church leaders in the Transforming Wigan movement he reflected on reaffirming our

covenant with God. He gave us a copy of the prayer

to take away with us.

Simplistically, the Bible's Old and New Testaments are Old and New Covenants. God's covenants with humankind are evident throughout the narrative of scripture and many understand that God 'covenants'

with specific people at specific times, we may think of Abraham, Moses and David. The New Covenant is a new relationship between God and humankind through Jesus. The verse

Luke 22:20 which makes its way into our communion service, recalls Jesus' words at the Last Supper, where he says that his blood shed on the cross is the seal of this New Covenant.



When we come to faith in God, through Jesus, we make a covenant with him. God calls us, and our response from the heart is a pledge and a promise that we offer our lives to him and to his purposes.

You may be like me, in that gradually, over time I find I have drifted away from the ideals and the intentions of my original covenant with God, when I offered all that I am to him.

A covenant prayer is a good way to reaffirm the commitment that we have to living out our faith. At the beginning of 2017, why not use this prayer — or one of your own, to state or restate your plans for this year, to humbly offer yourself in service to God and His Kingdom plans.

Regular Planned Giving

Regular, planned giving into the General Fund allows St Thomas and St Luke's to cover our greatest expense: our parish share and the ongoing costs to run and maintain our church buildings.

Did you know Direct Debit is the most efficient way to give? Pay by Direct Debit through the Parish Giving Scheme...

This is a scheme run by the Church of England, and allows giving to be done by Direct Debit instead of on the collection plate. This uses very little admin resource here at St Thomas' and St Luke's and avoids any bank charges. If you pay tax, with the PGS, the gift aid is received shortly afterwards, compared to waiting up to a year when we make our normal annual claim. Forms are available at the back of church or please speak to Sarah Riley (Treasurer) or Clare Hayton (Gift Aid Secretary).

With twists, turns, adventures and utter magic ... this is an utter treat and cannot be missed! St PAUL

St Paul's day is the 25th January and we remember him because he was one of the Church's greatest teachers. Called Saul by his parents, he was brought up a Pharisee and became a tent-maker. He was completely against the early Christians and was there when Stephen, the first Christian martyr was stoned to death. He searched out many Christians and handed them over the prison and death.

So why did he change? Like many people since, although few so dramatically, Saul changed because Jesus came into his life. You can read all about it in Acts, chapter 9. Everything changed for Saul but he had a hard time persuading people that it wasn't a trick. Even his name changed, and as Paul he travelled teaching and founding churches. To encourage these growing communities he wrote the 13 letters (or Epistles) we can still read today. These letters are the earliest parts of the New Testament to be written, some only 20 years after Jesus.




