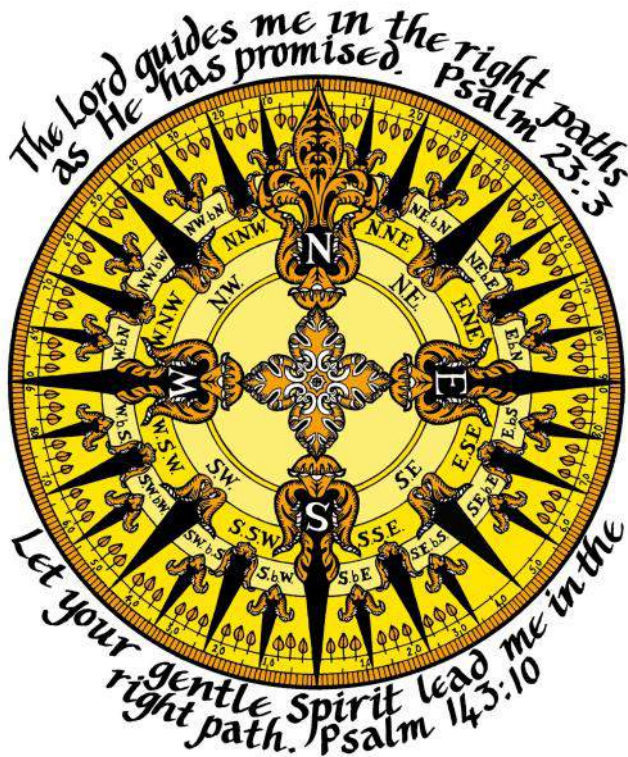

St Thomas' & St Luke's Giving Information

As Christians, we believe that everything we have is from God, and we offer back to him our time, our skills and money.

Regular Planned Giving Regular, planned giving into the General Fund allows St Thomas and St Luke's to cover our greatest expense: our parish share and the ongoing costs to run and maintain our church buildings.

Did you know Direct Debit is the most efficient way to give? Pay by Direct Debit through the Parish Giving Scheme...

This is a scheme run by the Church of England, and allows giving to be done by Direct Debit instead of on the collection plate. This uses very little admin resource here at St Thomas' and St Luke's and avoids any bank charges. If you pay tax, with the PGS, the gift aid is received shortly afterwards, compared to waiting up to a year when we make our normal annual claim. Forms are available at the back of church or please speak to Sarah Riley (Treasurer) or Clare Hayton (Gift Aid Secretary).

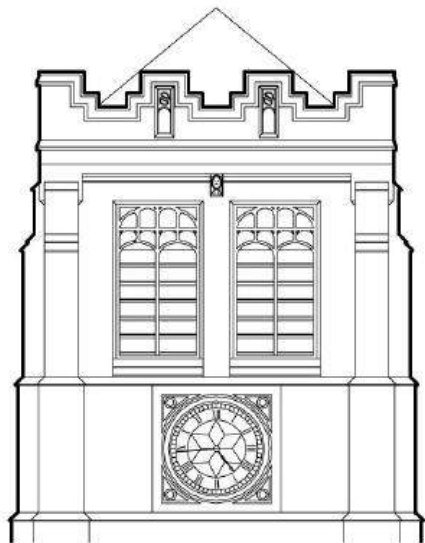

So Miriam got her mother.



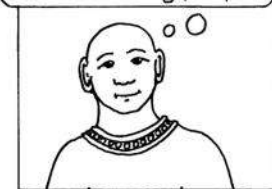
The princess adopted Moses as her son.

Justice League (12A)

In a Nutshell: Well, in all of these things, all roads must lead to this eventually... like Marvel and it's Avengers bounty and also their Defenders success on TV too, DC has decided that it must now combine all its characters to make a super team, but does it gel and flow and work well or clunk like a clunky clunker? Well a lovely gooey mix of it all to be truly and honestly fair, it does tend to clunk a lot... a lot actually but when it does work it's rather charming and fun and does what it needs to satisfy it's core group, but whereas Avengers was one of the finest movies of it's kind and The Defenders show on Netflix is rather good and quite solid and very strong, this is just... fine, simply yeah it's alright nothing special. Don't get me wrong, your principal cast is top notch and all giving exactly what is needed... whether it's a very dependable Affleck, the cheeky and Fun Miller as Flash, the lovely Gadot as Wonder Woman or a flash of some charm as Cavill finally has some fun in the Superman role... but the whole thing still winds up as squishy mess... from unfinished effects and bad CGI effects and a terrible villain through to a mixed feeling and attitude to setting up character and relationships, essentially what you have is something that has too many cooks spoiling it's own broth and while it has these pros and solid stuff that keep it with a solid score, it is essentially a mess and it really is certainly not going to sway those who still are very down on DC but will keep those young and old DC fans happy all the same... match these with a huge sense of fun and a very solid cast throughout you have a movie that may be big and flawed, but pulls off that exact quality with a smattering of aplomb.... after all, who always needs to be perfect?

18. Jurassic World: Fallen Kingdom (12A TBA) (Released: June 8th)
