





Letter from Sam

We spent February exploring 1 Peter in our sermon series thinking about: Worship, Discipleship, Mission, Leadership, and Community. At the end of the series, Sam reflects on some of Peter's closing words to the church.

Soren Kierkegaard, a Danish writer, once wrote in his journal: "All existence makes me anxious, from the smallest fly to the mysteries of the Incarnation." Perhaps you can empathize. Kierkegaard had recently undergone heartbreak. Regine Olsen, Kierkegaard's fiancé, had broken off their engagement and he had fallen into a long period of depression. That experience led him to a deeper understanding of the ways in which

anxiety is one of the definitive experiences of being human. On some level, to be human is to be anxious.

Over the past month or so, I've become more aware of the ways in which I'm anxious without always being conscious of it; anxious about the future, about relationships, about the state of the world. Everything from the



fruit flies to the incarnation. I'm not particularly good at stopping for long enough to listen to my heart and body, and to hear what they are telling me about what is really going on inside. When I pause for long enough to listen to myself, I become aware of the anxiety within me. When I pause for longer and listen to God, I am reminded of the words Peter writes to his fledgling house churches:



Letter from Sam

"Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you." 1 Peter 5.7

For the anxious and concerned those words offer relief. He cares for you. And in his caring he has become like you in every way. Those four words are worth dwelling with over the next month, or year. He cares for you. Like a mother with her child, we are cared for by God. We have not been forgotten, we have been remembered. We have been treasured up and brought to mind deep within God.

The church that Peter writes to, of course, has a great deal to be anxious about. Many faced persecution and martyrdom for their faith. Dorothy Bernard wrote: "courage is fear that has said its prayers." The growth of the early church is testament to their willingness to cast their anxieties onto Jesus and face the future with courage.

Over the next year, some of us will experience deep excitement and joy at the changes in our churches; for others they will be a source of anxiety. Our



prayer is that however you anticipate them, you would experience Jesus unending love for as the one who cares for you. And that together, we might say our prayers and face the coming year with courage and faith.

Glass (15)

Directed by M. Night Shyamalan

In a Nutshell: There are those films in life that you always thought deserved a sequel oh so highly but you told yourself it probably wouldn't because life isn't always fair in that way.... Then what should happen but the possibility arises. That was the feeling at the end of 2017's Split when Bruce Willis had a one second cameo to tease that more of Unbreakable could be on the way. Combining the worlds and characters of both Split and Unbreakable, Glass is a very unique and maybe flawed movie that really does something special nonetheless and is a treat for those like me who have been pumped for two whole years now. Naturally, the performances are all solid with Bruce on a better form than he's had for a while and Sam Jackson at his most deliciously Sam Jackson reprising one of his best roles, but James McAvoy is simply something else. It begs the question why these films are left out of awards recognition, because it's the biggest tour de force there is as he flawlessly portrays 24 different people seamlessly, it's something else entirely and somehow betters his stellar turn in Split. As with a M Night film, there are many twists and turns unleashed and revealed as the story reached its end. and I believe a huge factor in loving it, hating it or being severely 'ah well' is how you take the nature of these developments and what it does with them.... I worried about the direction but think this film keeps turning expectations around, it teases something then goes another way. The original Unbreakable arrived not long after the first X-Men movie and a year before Spider-Man. now in this Marvel obsessed world it's certainly time for a film that explores these tropes and their grounding in real life... the timing couldn't be better. Whilst certainly not perfect, this is an intriguing and very terrific climax to a very unique story.

In a Nutshell: It's always the tricky thing, playing real life icons in a movie or a real-life icon. Many have done it and won acclaim and awards, but it's always a daunting thing... whether its Joaquin as Cash, Foxx as Charles, Malek as Mercury, Downey as Chaplin, or Dicaprio as Hughes, it's a big task to take on; can you do justice to them and tell their story effectively. Well in the same vein as Chaplin, here comes another of those and it's just a true gem of a picture as they'd say, and I can say 100% that both actors are astounding and do justice to these characters and then some. It certainly helps that both actors are masters of the comedic arts already, so can go some way to capturing that comedic mastery of both Stan Laurel and Oliver Hardy whilst both are also terrific performers with proven record so they can also nail the emotional side and really delivery outstanding performances... but whilst both Reilly and Coogan are just perfect, the two ladies in their life are equally outstanding and steal the show several times, Arianda in particularly stealing whole chunks of the movie. Alongside this barrage of terrific performances that really capture the heart of the story is simply a beautiful amazing story of two total legends, really capturing the sweetness and the humour and the tragedy behind how it all came crashing down and then back up again. Really whirling you back to a golden age, this is a sweet, funny and heartwarming tale that tells a beautiful and sweet story so well. It will capture your heart and make you smile.






