Letter from South Hub Eco Team

Nine months ago, a 15 year old in Sweden decided to skip school. That's not necessarily news. Lots of 15 year olds skip school. They go to the park, or into town, or just stay at home sleeping. But Greta Thunberg did none of that. She got on a train and went to Poland to the UN Climate conference where she gave a speech to 200 world leaders. She said to them:

"I will not beg the world leaders to care for our future. I will instead let them know change is coming whether they like it or not."

When Greta left the summit, she invited school children around the world to join her in striking from school to protest lack of action over climate change. From Australia to England, India, Uganda and Nepal, hundreds of thousands of children have put down their pens and started to protest.

Greta and our children are telling us that this is an emergency. That we can no longer pretend that climate change isn't real, or that we aren't responsible, or that it doesn't matter to us.

There's a line in Isaiah which hints at the future of the world. It says 'the lion will lie down with the lamb, and a little child will lead them.' Perhaps we need to be humble enough to let ourselves be led by children to become more committed in our personal and collective attempts to stem the rising tide of climate change.

That's why over the coming months we'll be talking more about the environment and why it matters to God. We're going to be inviting you to consider the ways in which you can celebrate, protect, and nourish creation in your own homes and families.

We're doing this because we love God and God's beautiful creation, and because we no longer have the choice to ignore it.

Our hub now has its own Eco Champions who will be carrying out an eco-audit developed by A Rocha. Then we can reflect on what we can celebrate as well as what we could do better. On 19th May we will hold Green Services across the hub, focussing on creation and creation care.

In May, we're inviting you to act week by week in small ways that will make a difference to us and to the world we steward (check out our weekly challenges in this magazine). Pause for thought

We are all aware that there are renewed concerns in our church family causing much distress to some people. Particularly over the effect of the proposed alterations to the heating system necessitating the removal of pews. When I was preparing articles for this months magazine I was reminded of an article which I included in the May edition last year and which I felt moved to repeat.

"BEFORE YOU criticize your church, remember Christ loved the church and gave Himself for her.' He hasn't given up on His church, so don't you give up on it! And stop talking so much about what you don't like.

If your church was perfect, you'd be out of place! Noah didn't sail on The Queen Mary: he sailed on a glorified cattle boat. Can you imagine the noise, the confusion, and the violent tossing of a ship in a storm big enough to destroy the world? But here's the thing — everybody inside the ark was saved while everybody outside of it was lost. You may smile, but there's only one craft that's quaranteed to make it safely into heaven's port, and that's the old ship of salvation. Do things sometimes stink in the church? Sure. Jesus issued one of His harshest rebukes to Peter, the disciple who was destined to become a leader in the church: 'Get thee behind me, Satan: thou art an offence unto me: for thou savourest (smell] not the things that be of God, but those that be of men' (Matthew 16:23 KJV). But the great thing is that when you mess up, the same grace that restored Peter will be there for you too. So, the word for you today is: love your church! In effect it said that EVERY CHURCH has problems — and the people who cause them. It has always been so, we are asked to consider the Corinthian church. Some members got drunk during communion, and others wouldn't attend unless their favourite preacher was speaking. One man was even having an affair with his stepmother (see 1 Corinthians 5:1). Sitting beside you on Sunday mornings there maybe some very confused and upset people but God keeps working with us, because He sees our potential value to His kingdom. Noah didn't jump ship for the same reason you shouldn't leave your church — there's no better alternative. Paul and 276 others were in a storm from which it looked like no one would survive. Nevertheless he told them. 'Unless (you] stay on board the ship, you cannot be saved.' Does that mean it's always wrong to leave a church? No. but make sure your reasons are scriptural and not self-centred. You say, 'But the pastor's sermons are too long.' Paul once preached so long that a man sitting in a thirdstorey window fell asleep, plummeted to the ground, and died. And what did Paul do? He laid hands on him, revived him, set him back in the window and made him listen to the rest of the sermon! (see Acts 20:9-11). Seriously, if your church has problems, don't leave; stay and pray. That's how things get changed to how God wants them changed.

The article ends with a plea that I would earnestly repeat that is that we pray for a strong commitment to our church and to do God's will for us in this place, putting aside personal feelings and having in mind the future of the kingdom here in Ashton.

For kindness spreads her ever open arms, and a stranger may become a friend this day.



May Eco Challenges

Sunday 28th-April -4th May

Attitude of gratitude! Begin by thanking God for what we already have. If you are able, why not start the week by going for a walk outside and writing down 20 things you are grateful for in creation.

Sunday 5th -11th May

Get your waste into one bag! The UK generates 3.7 million tonnes of plastic waste. It often ends up in countries like Malaysia, Vietnam, and Thailand. Set yourself the challenge of fitting all your landfill waste into one bin bag this week (or if you already do that, into a smaller bag than normal!) Handy hint: check each item before throwing away – could it go into food waste instead? Or be recycled? You could also try and cur down on non-recyclable plastic in your weekly shop!) When you take out your bin, pray for people who are impacted by the waste we export.

Sunday 12th-18th May

Check your home appliances! Turn your thermostat down 1 degree (or radiator down one notch) and unplug gadgets/lights when not in use.

Sunday 19th-25th May

Try a meat-free meal! Meat production is a major contributor to climate change via greenhouse gases. Switch up a meal and swap your meat for a delicious vegetarian alternative (beans and pulses are a great swap, and cheaper too!) Consider doing it more regularly. If you're a vegetarian, share your favourite veggie recipe with a friend.

Captain Marvel (12)

Directed by Anna Boden and Ryan Fleck

Stars: Brie Larson, Samuel L. Jackson, Ben Mendelsohn, Jude Law, Clark Gregg, Annette Bening, Lashana Lynch, Gemma Chan, Rune Temte, Diimon Honsou, and MacKenna Grace

In a Nutshell: Expectations are a tough thing, then again repeat viewings are a great thing... and the Marvel Cinematic Universe widely accommodates both things aplenty; because with each new movie, the expectation is sky high yet you're guaranteed to see each one about 4 times at least on the big screen, so even if it might not always gel the first one, you're guaranteed to reap rewards from repeat viewings that could iron out any issues in the long run and so it proves with the mighty Captain Marvel! This occurs because as much as it's filled with excellent action and genuinely superb turns from Larson, Mendelsohn, Jackson and Bening and some great 90s nostalgia; there are certain plot moments and twists that on first viewing I had reservations about and couldn't get my head right with... but subsequent repeat viewings have ironed this out and I can now actually say that these plot moments are actually guite subversive and fun and really run the other way from expectations in a way that's daring and fun, even if a few tiny moments are more predictable than they seem. All the elements are in their usual stride: an excellent cast with some great stand out turns (even if a few get a bit overlooked), terrific effects, fun origin story but then these are mixed with some cool elements such as a ace 90s soundtrack, some neat callbacks and call forwards and benefits wonderfully from taking place when it does and leading into what lies ahead. At the end of the day, it's kinda everything you need.... It seems to be a sci-fi action fest origin for its character but what it really delivers and

really does is blending a terrific buddy comedy template with something truly daring in its plot development and throwing it through into a simply fun and cool movie for everyone that is fun, funny and just oh so cool. The future of Marvel is in good beaming hands, and now let's see what she does next, could it be that she is the key to saving the Avengers?

Dumbo (PG)

In a Nutshell: Surely there will come a day where every single of the Disney movies has been remade into live action but it's highly unlikely: maybe for one because as sure as they'll keep remaking them, they'll also keep releasing solid new animations but also because not everything needs remaking. But one those grounds, why do we then have a live action version of Dumbo? Never mind that Tim Burton is a perfect director to realize such a vision and also just the age-old premise of 'oh why not': the idea does seem peculiar and as such the most out-there ideas always work the best. Taking a linear story and simple premise from the original 1 hour long movie and doubling the length has forced the filmmakers to add a lot more story, depth and feeling to the way the story moves and have added a host of characters to the mix including marvelous turns from DeVito and Keaton who it is such a thrill to see back together on screen again whilst Farrell is dependably strong as ever leading the way as the human hero of the piece and Eva Green is well, Eva Green and all the more dazzling for it. The effects dazzle as ever, you will genuinely believe an elephant can fly and there are terrific nods to Casey Jr and Pink Elephants. The big elements of sadness and darkness still lurk and add real harrowing depth to the story in its treatment of the animal cast and the immediate danger that places on the plot as it moves forward: but matching this with a move into the fantastical as the movie reaches it final act and a very sly dig at Disneyland in an actual Disney movie prove that maybe Burton really is a bold move to put his stamp on this particular tale. Both dazzling, thrilling and moving; here is a very worthwhile revisiting of a story from a real visionary and one I can guarantee will be enjoyed by one and all.


