Baptisms are held at St Thomas Church at 12.45 on the 2nd & 4th Sundays. Baptisms at St Luke's are at 11 am on the 3rd Sunday.

To qualify for baptism parents should live within the parish boundaries or be a regular worshipper at St Thomas's/St Luke's. Parents and Godparents should also be prepared to undertake baptism preparation classes.

Marriage

You can marry in a C of E church of your choice if certain criteria are shown to be met. For details please contact the vicar or call in at Vestry Hour on a Thursday evening.

Funerals

Every parishioner has the right to a service in church, followed by a committal.



Letter from the Curate



On my bookcase this summer, there have been 5 invitation cards – four for weddings and one for a baptism. All beautifully made – the artwork on one was a present from the groom's cousin – a published artist; on another, as you opened the card, two pieces of string pulled themselves into a lovers knot; and on another the bunting at the top of the invitation spelled out the baby's name. All very personal – designed to bring a smile to your face, connect you with the occasion, and draw you closer to the joy and the celebration in prospect.

When we receive a personal invitation, especially to a celebration – we want to be able to say yes don't we – we begin to think about what we can move in our diaries so that we can accept! We feel special because we've been included, we feel connected to those who've invited us.

Research done by the national church says that many more people would come to church – if only they were invited personally. There are lots of reasons why people stop coming to church, or never begin in the first place. There are lots of things we can do to encourage them to give church a go, but it all begins with that personal invitation.



At its heart invitation is perhaps the oldest idea of all, it's what made shepherds leave their flocks, fishermen leave their nets, and tax collectors climb out of trees. Jesus – an irresistible inviter of people!

We have, beginning right now, a whole season of opportunities to invite someone to church - between Back to Church Sunday on Sept 27th, and our Christmas Services in December. Sometimes we're nervous about asking, sometimes the person we invite is nervous about saying yes – so it's great to have more than one opportunity to



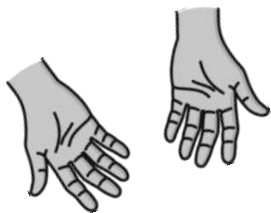

invite and be invited.

Here's the story of one family who responded to an invitation to come to St Thomas' on Back to Church Sunday last year:

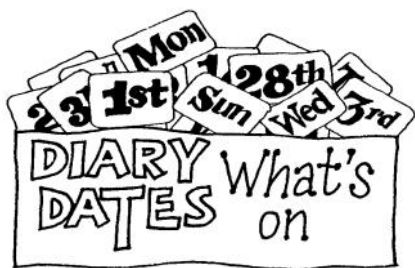
After we had our daughter, we had discussed the importance of our faith. We both enjoyed Sunday school as part of our upbringing and felt we would like our little girl to have the same experience. Our friend and colleague knew this and therefore she kindly invited us to join her at St.Thomas'. This made us feel very welcome and gave us that push to walk through our church doors. We have been welcomed by all and even more so when our daughter has been shouting or should I say "singing". Feeling part of the church has led us towards our daughter's baptism, which we are all excited about. Thank you to you all for making us feel so welcome.

With this magazine, you should receive a card. I wonder who you will give yours to? The Bible tells us we only need faith as small as a mustard seed to see God do great things. I believe we only need courage as small as a mustard seed too – courage to turn to someone we know and say 'would you like to come with me?' – we can all do that!



You are the key resource to grow our church – your willingness to offer a personal, friendly invitation – not just once, but over a whole season. If you come to our services already, why not invite someone along with you. If you receive home communion from us, why not invite a neighbour along to your next home communion visit. If you don't currently come to church but enjoy reading our magazine, why not come to one of our services on Back to Church Sunday – you would be made very welcome.

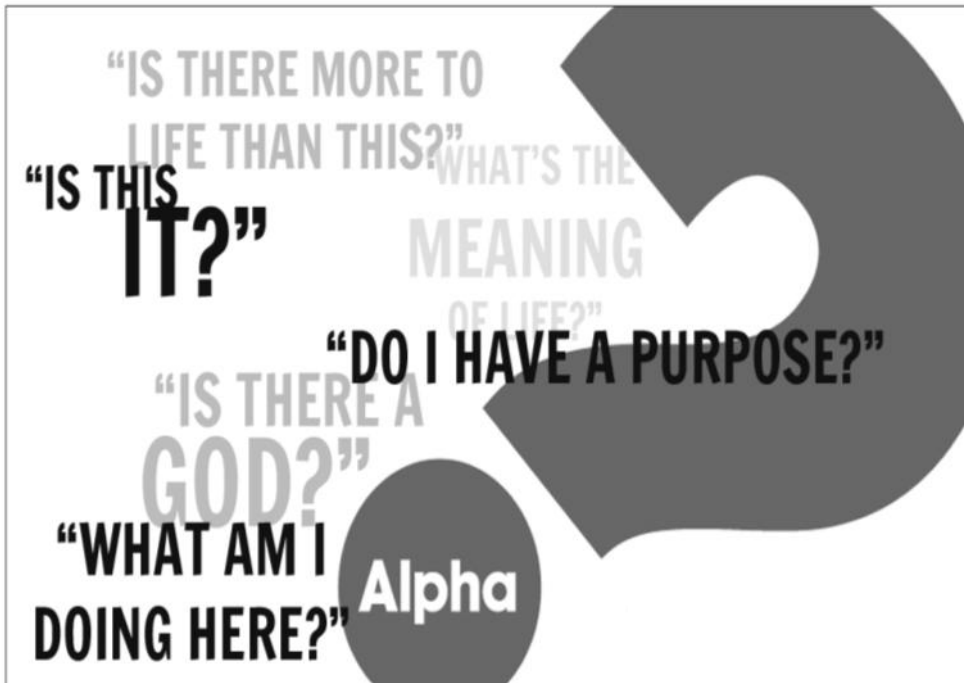

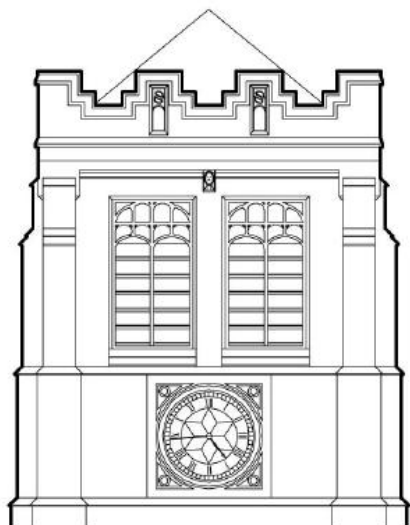

In a Nutshell: Guardians of the Galaxy eh? If every there was a benchmark for Marvel movies, that was it... you can do something really out there and crazy and impossible to make work... and yet make it work because you're Marvel and somehow you can do anything. So can it happen again, I mean who's heard of Ant Man, it's a bit of a jump from Iron Man and Captain America isn't it? Oh and the original director, the wonderful Edgar Wright bailed after creative differences... oh dear surely? Well Marvel wills it and it happens, because whilst it isn't quite Guardians (but what is?) it sure is a blast from first second to last and another absolutely wonderful ride. As with all these things, it's in the casting of the leads where the gold begins and casting Paul Rudd and Michael Douglas is no exception, both as terrific as the mentored and the mentor respectively, Rudd particularly channelling his innate likeability into a role with extra stakes. Great support is had too, particularly by the wonderful Michael Pena stealing every scene plus Evangeline Lilly in a terrific foil for Rudd that is only going to expand with future movies. As with things like Honey I Shrunk the Kids, of course the shrinking effects are cool but looking how far we've come since 1989 of course it's pushed to the next level and is all sorts of cool... and of course, everything fits in wonderfully with the ever expanding Marvel Universe including cameos and sequel hints.... basically everything you want and more. Good things come in the smallest sizes sometimes.... **Rating: 10/10**

In a Nutshell: It's hard having a reputation so good sometimes, when you finally make the smallest slip it makes people gasp out very loud indeed. So it is with Pixar, long known as the best animation studio around with a flawless record of amazing movies, then along came Cars which I'll admit is fine (I even enjoyed the sequel) but doesn't hit all cylinders as flawlessly as all their other movies do, then films such as Brave and Monsters University were solid but not 100% and to some that is enough to suggest Pixar had

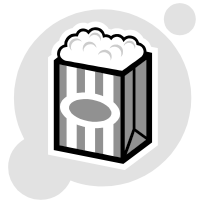


lost it. Cue Inside Out, easily the most stunning movie of the year and a future classic that proves Pixar they always had it. The scale, the imagination, the wit, the emotion... never mind Pixar, if most movie studios and movies non stop were like this... we'd be in special days indeed, alas we're not always so lucky. As always there is a lovely voice cast with special props to Amy Poehler as the ever bright and cheery Joy leading the emotions in Riley's head, a concept that is so simple yet so layered and effective, it will change your outlook on your life and the way you lead your life forever in the most wonderful way. There is laughter to be had and fun situations but the main thing here is a raw emotion that is really something bittersweet and special... in essence this is a film about growing up, the end of childhood and in ways the death of innocence... such a deep and moving message for a family movie but one in the capable hands of Pixar, that is done 100% with the upmost attention, care, and beauty. It has everything and will veer you from laughing to sobbing hard and having the most uplifting experience... it's simply unmissable and simply a thing of absolute beauty.... **Rating: 10/10**

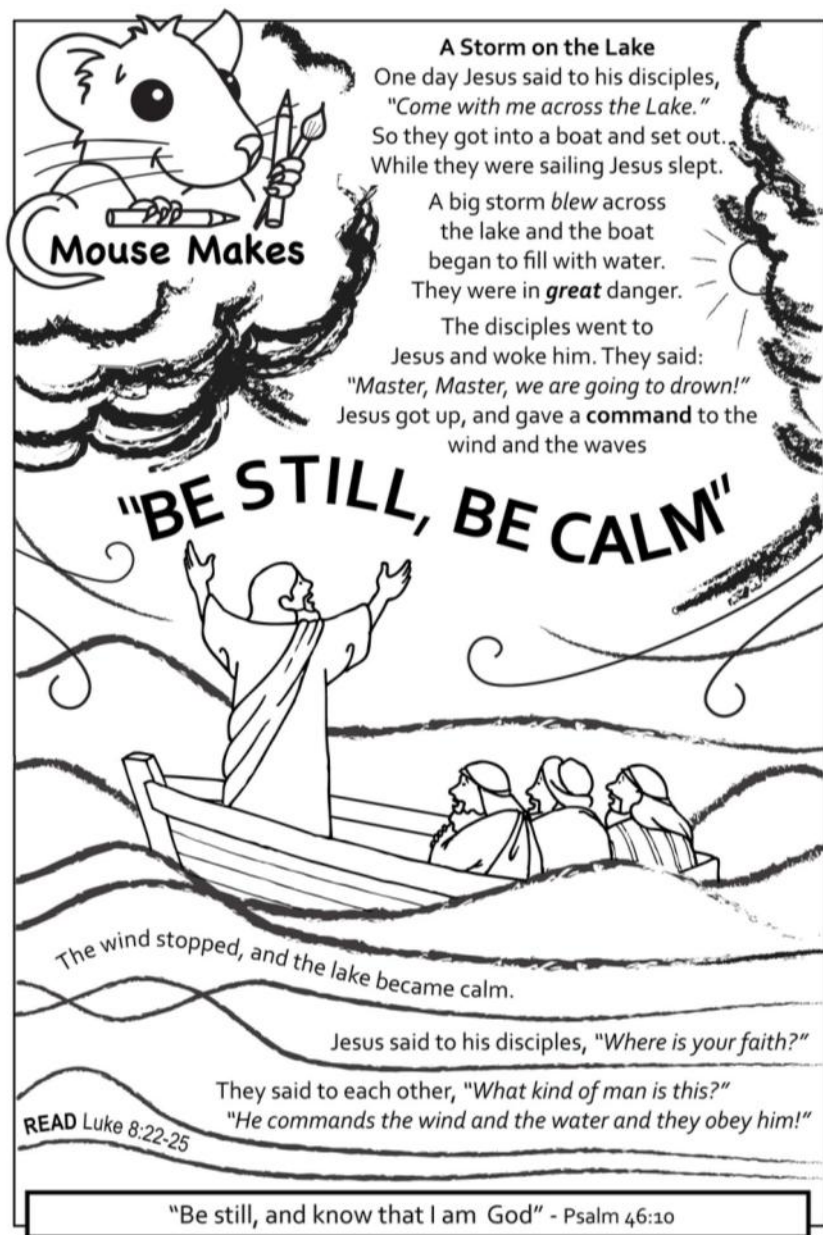
