

Bishop Pauls Easter Message 2015

Don't you hate knowing the end of a film before you have had the chance to see it for vourself? Having the clever twist, the final act, the big reveal known to us can change the way we approach and perceive the story. But of course that's how we see the Easter story today.



As the drama of Holy Week unfolds, as we see the storm gather around Jesus, we witness the biased and corrupt trial proceedings. We are horrified by the cruel and brutal punishment being meted out. And yet at all times in the back of our minds we have the knowledge of the resurrection.

This is one story that is enhanced by the knowledge of the final twist. For to have only part of the picture, an incomplete story, means we are left in a state of fear and paralysis. The liberating knowledge that God can conquer all things transforms the story, gives us all the strength and encouragement to tackle what we face in our lives.

In the immediate aftermath of Jesus' death the disciples themselves had no idea how the story would end. They were disillusioned and confused, running scared and in disarray. But the knowledge of the resurrection and power of the Holy Spirit enabled them to form themselves into a group equipped and empowered to spread the Gospel throughout the known world – to turn that world upside down.

There are many times in each of our lives when we might wish we know the end of a particular story or of a situation we're facing. When we could have the certainty that the decisions we will make will be



right, just, and see our work crowned with glory. But sadly, so often we can feel in the Saturday shadow of the cross, looking back to defeat rather than forward towards hope.

Sadder still are the large numbers we encounter who have no idea that hope is even possible - who haven't heard what God can do, who haven't experienced his life enhancing, life transforming love. It is to them we, as a church wanting to make a bigger difference, are reaching.

In every parish and every community in our diocese that sense of hope can be offered in the work we do – pastoral care, feeding the poor, speaking about the way our society should be led and should be shaped. What these things have in common is hope. Hope for the poor, hope for the lonely, hope for the vulnerable, hope for the scared.

We are empowered to make that difference because we know the story. We know it ends with the promise of the Spirit and the hope of eternal life. We can be difference-makers because we are part of the story. And we know how it ends.

The Parish Giving Scheme

This new scheme is another example of a situation were your Parish needs **YOU.** It has been developed and is now in place in 90 Diocese across the country. It has been accepted by our own PCC and it is now necessary that we go ahead to implement it in our Parish.

Let me explain, the Scheme which works on the basis that your regular donations are made on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis, whichever you choose, with direct debit payments on the 1st of the month. The benefit to Church finances is that your full gift and any associated Gift Aid is automatically credited to our accounts on the 10th of the same month and with a considerable saving in administration. Don't be alarmed as there is no long term commitment as you can change or cancel the amount at anytime by a simple phone call.

The fact that Gift Aid is added immediately, does really make it particularly important that our regular givers, who are tax payers, convert to the scheme. In the past we have had to wait, sometimes a number of years, for the Gift Aid to be credited to us.

This arrangement means that we gain the extra 25 pence for every pound you give within 10 days of the gift.

The forms are available on request from me or from our Treasurer Sarah and if you have any questions we would both be happy to answer these in the strictest confidence.

I cannot put too much emphasis on the importance of your embracing the scheme without delay. If you do go ahead and currently have a standing order in place please do not cancel this until you hear from the Diocese that the new arrangement is in place.


We pray that Enid and May be at peace with our Lord Jesus Christ in his Everlasting Arms forever.





In a Nutshell: You could be forgiven for thinking Disney need Pixar to help make solid films, but thankfully, their more recent fare from Tangled and Frozen through to Wreck it Ralph have proved that theory wrong, and Big Hero 6, well it simply makes it into nothing but a silly thought. Brimming with invention, pathos, a ton of humour and beautiful everything.... Big Hero 6 is everything a family movie, a action movie, a comedy movie, a superhero movie and a movie itself should be. Christian Aid Week (10–16th May)

This year, Britain's longest running door-to-door fundraising week is asking Ashton residents to support

women living in poverty around the world, many of whom are discriminated against from birth.

Christian Aid Week is taking place between Sunday 10 and Saturday 16 May and, as usual, we will be delivering envelopes to most of the homes around Ashton. These collections will help to transform the lives of women like Loko, from Ethiopia. Four times a week, Loko makes an eight-hour journey to gather wood to support her family. She said: "If I can't collect firewood, my children will starve". As she walks, she prays: "I ask God to change my life and lead us out of this". Just £5 could give Loko a loan to start her own business buying and selling tea and coffee, releasing her to spend more time caring for her family.

Discrimination against women is one of the greatest injustices of our time and the statistics speak for themselves. Globally, less than 20 per cent of landholders are women and women do twice as much unpaid work as men. In many countries girls are treated like second-class citizens while boys are provided with opportunities for an education, work, food and even decision making at the expense of their sisters. Almost as soon as girls are strong enough to walk many can spend hours fetching water and doing household chores.

Often forced into early marriages, they can also face the dangers of giving birth before their young bodies are ready. Deprived of an education, later in life women have to rely on men for their financial security, with any hope of following their own dreams dashed, leaving them vulnerable to deprivation and violence.

This inequality, often exacerbated by harmful social norms, leaves millions of women at the mercy of violence and abuse, with one-in-three women across the world experiencing physical or sexual violence. Millions remain in the shadows, denied a say in the decisions that affect their lives.



- a ruler, scissors and a glue stick.




Fold the long strip of card in half and then each half back on itself to make a W shape.
