

Every parishioner has the right to a service in church, followed by a committal.




# Letter from the Vicar



"So there's this table. It's a simple table but it's well made, because it was made by a carpenter. The guy who made it is a poor man, but he's generous. He offers a place at the table to anyone who wants to sit and eat. This is a table that started in one place but now it can stretch down every street, and it can go into every home, if people want to sit the re....

The poor man's name is Jesus, who though he was rich, yet for our sakes he became poor so that through his poverty we might become

rich. And if you sit at his table he will feed you and he will ask you to feed others; he will serve you and he will ask you to serve others; he will. love you and he will ask you to love others."



Installation Service. The image of the invitation to the table is powerful because it reminds us that in our Christian faith we understand that this invitation is for now and for every one of us. We are invited into God's presence now, and through faith in Jesus we are offered an eternity with him, for God's Kingdom exists either side of our death.



We anticipate the birth of Jesus through the Advent season and then at Christmas celebrate his coming as one of us. This is a great time to think for ourselves about our own response to the invitation to God's table.

It is a time to know the love of God the Father that sent his Son to us, and to be sure that his love and invitation are for you. Bishop Paul reflects that as we accept the invitation to the table, we find that Jesus sits beside each one of us.

# The Film Review With Rob Carson



Gone Girl (18) Directed by David Fincher

Stars: Ben Affleck, Rosamund Pike, Carrie Coon, Tyler Perry, Neil Patrick Harris, Kim Dickens, Patrick Fugit, Missi Pyle, Casey Wilson, and Sela Ward

In a Nutshell: The great thing about some movies is you really can't ever expect what they will be. I'm not even starting on this one in terms of what it could be or what it is, but there aren't many expectations which can be fulfilled. This is a lot darker and twisted than what you can expect, but is also a lot more satricial and humorous than you could ever suspect too. It isn't about to be tied down into it's own little circle. But I won't go on about how it defies expectations because that hints too much about it's secrets and this being a film where you want to think everything is as it seems, I don't want to tell too much. What I can say is as to be expected from Fincher, the film looks stunning... full of great camera choices, beautifully shot imagery and great lighting. The performances kinda across the board are phenomenal, but special mention to Rosamund Pike who, again with spoling, is transcendental... just a career best turn and definetly one of the awards come next year, but also Affleck is superbly strong and flawed as Nick... the catch being that everyone is watching his every turn waiting for him to slip up, a critique perhaps on the way the audiences perceive Ben himself? This is at both a dark thriller and a interesting treatise on relationships and how they work... Fincher once again excels himself, and provides a really gloomy and interesting tale that will provide much discussion and will stick with you and disturb you more than any horror tale that's around.... both dark and chilling yet strangely satirical and funny and witty in parts, it's a real cocktail of intrigue and well worth checking out for yourself.... find it before it's gone! Rating: 9/10

Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles (12A) Directed by Jonathan Liebsman

Stars: Megan Fox, William Fichtner, Will Arnett, Tony Shaloub (voice), Johnny Knoxville (voice), Tohoru Masamune, Noel Fisher, Pete Ploszek, Jeremy Howard, and Whoopi Goldberg

In a Nutshell: It was so easy with this latest adaptation of the heroes in a half shell, to be a big cynic. Oh Michael Bay is taking my childhood heroes and making them more gritty and a bit more teen rather than family friendly and doing a Transformers. But at the end of the day, you just have to sit back and think 'but it's the Turtles and they still look like they're doing turtley things'. And boy was that the best option because this is flat out fun for Turtles fans and for new audiences too, yeah there's the odd Bay flourish that jars but not too much, and besides if you remember that those 90s Turtles movies were hardly

perfect... then who are we to gripe too much? Yes, Megan Fox is hardly wonderful but she does a decent job of portraying the plucky April O'Neill and is eminently likeable throughout, whilst the wonderful Will Arnett is terrific counterpoint as her long suffering cameraman. Not to mention the ever reliable William Fichtner is on hand as a shady character with a vital role to play, plus there's a great cameo for Whoopi Goldberg as Aprils' boss. Regardless of how it may seem, the effects for the Turtles



themselves is actually fairly solid... yeah they are more intimidating and creepy but it works and they act like the Turtles we know and love. It's like with a few of the Transformers movies, put your brain at the door and leave your prejudices behind... because this is Turtley good fun! Rating: 8/10



### The story of the Christingle

The word 'Christingle' actually means 'Christ Light', and celebrates the light of Jesus coming into the world. Stories of how the Christingle began look back to the Moravian Church, which is found in the Czech Republic. The Moravians have held Christingle services

for more than 200 years, and according to them, this is how the first Christingle might have been made:

Many years ago the children in a village were asked to bring a Christmas gift to put beside the crib in the church. One family was very poor, and had no money for gifts, but the three children were still determined to take something. The only nice thing they had was an orange, so they decided to give the Christchild that. But then they discovered the top was going green, so the eldest cut it out, and put a candle in the hole. To add some colour, one of the girls took a red ribbon from her hair and tied it around the middle of the orange. It was hard to make the ribbon stay still, so they fastened it in place with toothpicks. The toothpicks looked a bit bare, so the

The children took their decorated orange lantern to the church for the Christmas Mass. The other children sneered at their meagre gift, but the priest seized upon it with joy. He held it up as an example of the true understanding of the meaning of Christmas, for the following reasons: the orange is round, like the world; the candle gives us light in the dark, like the love of God; the red ribbon goes round the 'world', as a symbol of Christ's blood, given for everyone; the four sticks point in all directions, and symbolise that God is over all: North, South, East and West; and the fruit and nuts remind us of God's blessings.

The Children's Society first introduced the Christingle Service to The Church of England in 1968, and it has since become a popular event in the church calendar. This candlelit celebration is an ideal way to share the key messages of the Christian faith, while helping to raise vital funds to help vulnerable children across the country. Visit:

Angels are God's messengers and you can read about the good news they brought to the shepherds in Luke's Gospel, chapter 2, verses 8-20.


#### MAKE YOUR OWN CHRISTMAS ANGEL

You can make a whole host of angels, one for the top of the tree and a row of them, all different sizes, to go on a windowsill. To alter the size simply draw a bigger or smaller circle, you could use a dinner plate or a small tin to draw round. You could even make a giant angel using a dustbin lid!

#### You will need:

Scissors, thick white paper or thin white card, some felt tip pens and something circular to draw round (use a small plate or saucer to start with).

- Draw a circle on the paper and cut it out. Mark the centre of the circle (lightly fold it into quarters to find the centre).
- Copy the face and features on to the circle and colour them in
- Mark the dotted lines and cut around them and around the halo and hair as marked.
- Fold the angel into a cone by putting one wing over the other and slotting them together. A little piece of sellotape will hold it firmly.


