

### Letter from the Vicar

When a child comes forward at Communion and I pray a prayer of blessing, one of the parts of the prayer is often - if not always - 'and may Jesus be your friend forever'. I am praying that in a close relationship with Jesus they may find in him a source of love, peace, guidance, strength and of life itself.

I find myself reading once again a special book to me - 'Anam Cara' by John O'Donahue. It's special because it was given to me by a family friend, Father Luke McGee, a little while before I became a Christian. It is special because it was one of the significant things that opened my mind to find more about who Jesus could be to me.

One of the concepts of Celtic tradition is captured in the phrase 'anam cara' which is Gaelic for soul friend. In the early Celtic church, a person who acted as a teacher, companion or spiritual guide was called an anam cara. In Celtic understanding, when you had an anam cara you were joined in an eternal way 'with the friend of your soul'.

When O'Donahue offered the news that Jesus is the secret anam cara of every individual it was a revelation to me at the time. If in friendship with Jesus we enter into an eternal relationship with God himself, then that was something I wanted to find out more about. And through the friendship, teaching and companionship of some great spiritual guides I did.

The gospel message of Jesus of course is more than just friendship, but what a place to start a relationship. I leave you with a blessing from John

O'Donahue's book, which is a far more eloquent and thoughtful prayer than my words 'and may Jesus be your friend':

May you be blessed with good friends.

May you learn to be a good friend to your self.

May you be able to journey to that place in your soul where there is great love, warmth, feeling and forgiveness.

May it transfigure that which is negative, distant or cold.

May you be brought in to the real passion, kinship and affinity of belonging.

May you treasure your friends.

May you be good to them and may you be there for them; may they bring you all the blessings, challenges, truth and light that you need for your journey.

May you never be isolated; but may you always be in the gentle nest of belonging with your anam cara.

### Parish Giving Scheme

In previous editions of the Magazine I have explained this Scheme and the considerable benefits to the finances of **our** Parish. The progress of implementation has been so encouraging that I wanted firstly to thank those Church members, in excess of 40 ,who have already set up the direct debits and of course secondly to encourage others to join.

It is really a brilliant method of making regular donations especially if you are a tax payer and can sign the gift aid declaration which adds 25 pence to every pound that you give. The real plus is that the we receive the gift aid in so short a time as 10 days after the donation is made. Yes on the 10th of each month the gift aid is in our Church account.

The Scheme is open to everyone who has a bank account and not only to those who already have standing orders payable to Church. For those people who feel somewhat embarrassed at the thought of not putting collection on the plate as it comes round during the service we have tokens to replace envelopes or cash. These tokens simply say that your collection is given through Parish Giving. I have included below an example of the token showing both sides. In its back to back issued form it is the size of the Parish Giving Scheme logo as shown.

### The Film Review With Rob Carson



### Tommorowland (12A) Directed by Brad Bird

Stars: Britt Robertson, George Clooney, Hugh Laurie, Tim McGraw, Kathryn Hahn, Raffey Cassidy, Keegan-Michael Key, Thomas Robinson, Chris Bauer, Judy Greer, and Matthew MacCaull

In a Nutshell: A film is all well and good... it entertains nations, makes you chuckle or cry or scream and you have a grin on your face. But a film with ideas, now that can inspire you and challenge you... make you want to go out and do something, or maybe even make the world a better place. Brad Bird has always been a underrated genius of a director, from his animated gems like The Incredibles and Iron Giant not to mention Ratatouille and making the best Mission Impossible movie yet with Ghost Protocol... give him a massive canvas to play with and some serious ideas, and oh boy are we in for something unique. Based on the idea that Walt Disney was preparing the way to build a city that would build on the ideas of tomorrow and feature the best talents and minds from around the world... to say too much about this movie would spoil it's surprises and ideas but it's fuelled by the vision of Disney and the idea of making the future a better place for all. 

### **TAKING & GIVING**


If you look at a map of Israel you will see that there are two small inland seas. And if you look closely you will see that these two seas are linked by the River Jordan. The river starts in the northern hills and goes through the Sea of Galilee, then through the Jordan valley, and ends up in the Dead Sea. But even though the water is all from the same river, the two seas are completely different.

All around the Sea of Galilee are towns and villages, trees and farms. The Dead Sea has no trees or farms, it is dead. What makes the difference? The Sea of Galilee is alive because it has an outlet. It passes the water on as quickly as it flows in. The Dead Sea is dead because it passes no water on.

In St Luke's Gospel we read what Jesus said about giving – 'Give to others, and God will give to you' (chapter 6, verses 27-28). Unlike the two seas we can choose how we want to be: to give and take and be alive. Or just to take - and become sad and lifeless.




