

Letter from the Vicar

Sadly, as I write, our partner church St Peter's closes its building this weekend. Our thoughts and prayers are with each person affected by this – and there will be many. We



can only imagine how difficult this decision has been. As we support our brothers and sisters in Bryn, we may take time to wonder what such a step would mean for us if we were in their situation.

If we are displaced from the familiar building that we have worshipped in for decades, one of the first things that we would have to consider is 'where do we go to church?' And then maybe, 'what does it mean to go to church?'



A good starting point will be the definition of church as 'a group of Christians; church is a biblical word for assembly.' Remember also Alison Morgan's definition of church as 'the plural of disciple.' The church is the people

who have made Jesus the leader of their lives - we don't go to church; we are the church. We read in the book of Acts that the first Christians didn't have church buildings, they met as church in people's homes. The houses didn't become churches - the church met in them - worshipping communities, gathered in praise of God.

St Peter's Church will gather in a different place for the moment. Whether meeting in a school or other building, they

will still be church. As partner churches we look to see how we can be open to support and encourage our friends at St Peters and find new ways of working more closely together.




Archbishop Justin Welby said that we are called to be so rooted and familiar with our tradition that we are able to improvise. St Peter's experience over the coming months can be an influence and encouragement to others within our partnership and within the wider Transforming Wigan movement as we seek God's will in establishing many new worshipping communities – meeting in new locations and on different days of the week.

I pray that in this time of change and renewed discovery of identity, that focussed on Jesus, St Peter's will find a real blessing in fellowship, be creative in working out new ways of being church and continue to thrive.

New Wine conference (Harrogate): Saturday 23rd April

On Saturday 23rd April, nine women from the parish boarded a minibus and set off to Harrogate for a New Wine* conference specifically for women.



We entered the conference centre and were given a free goodie bag, which included a New Wine music CD, hand lotion and sweets.



We had a fantastic speaker on the day a lady called Jo Saxton. She was a truly inspiring and motivational speaker, who really encourages. Her talks focussed around being an oak of righteousness, and

how wonderful it is when God transforms and the positive effect on lives, families and communities. We were then encouraged to consider the things God has called us to do, that we have forgotten about or dismissed.

We heard from a two charities; Boaz charity and Project Paddington. Boaz spoke about the work they do with refugees. The founder of Project Paddington shared how the idea of Project Paddington was a response after seeing the horrors that refugee children were enduring.

Worship at New Wine is a key part of the conference and there are several times of worship. God of Angel armies being sung out across the conference centre was amazing.



Within the venue were stalls selling a whole range of Christian items such as books, art, jewellery, gifts as well as stalls promoting charities such as Compassion and Boaz trust.

New Wine hold a number of events across the year, aimed at the whole church (not just women). We had a fantastic day, and I do really encourage you to think about coming along next year. For those who have done the Alpha course, can you remember how special the Holy Spirit day was? It was a day to put aside all troubles, to focus on God, to enjoy great fellowship and some great worship. For me the New Wine conference is also a special day, and has become an annual feature in my calendar.





In a Nutshell: How exactly do you start a review of this film? So hotly awaited, so epic in it's ambition and scope... and with what has gone before, it's go a lot to live up to and expand upon in terms of continuing the story, fulfilling the back story of the many parts of the Marvel universe and then furthering the emotion and story arcs into the next bold and blistering chapter... to say it does all of this with flying colours and then so may not really be a surprise as it is what is genuinely to be expected but oh boy, all the same it is a treat to witness anyway. I won't go into detail as to what the events of the movie involve as the biggest treat is discovering the plot as it rolls along at a fantastic pace, never letting up or slowing down and keeping the plot threads coming thick and fast, both existing plot lines and some new ones intersect beautifully to create a tapestry that really does send the story hurtling forward whilst also weaving in plenty of existing plot threads to be

resolved or left to carry on, it really is a dazzling achievement... the effects are top and the action is blisteringly fantastic. Character wise, everyone has their great arcs and turns into great performances... not least the leads. In what is now his sixth turn as Iron Man, Downey Jr is fantastic... really wracked with guilt and pain and in trying to turn a



leaf becoming more dangerous than ever and worryingly more arrogant than ever, it's a tricky thing to get right but he nails it and it's terrific, whilst Evans further hones his terrific turn as the all American Mr. Perfect who has a dark edge and a dangerous streak which is always on the verge of toppling into vigilante... and out of the others, Boseman really shines as the complex Black Panther, whilst Tom Holland steals the film as the new Spider-Man, the most perfect version of the character yet which is all I'll say.... whilst Olsen, Stan and Bruhl turn in really complex and terrific turns too. This is a film that a review won't do justice to... so I won't go on, suffice to say it's everything you want and more... probably not the really, really best but right up there with the best there's been in the genre.....

In a Nutshell: Imagine the most upmost joy and fun and wonder you could experience or feel.... then as that joy rises, jolt a little or a lot to the side as something flies past.... then sing a song or two and take a deep breath and then smile a lot. Congratulations, this is a lot like the experience of witnessing this new wonderful version of the classic Disney tale. From it's stunning vistas and photo realistic animal effects through it's superb voice cast and terrific lead performance, via it's tension, humour and fun adventure... this is a bonafide treat from start to finish and could well be one of the best family adventure films of so many years past. All this rests nicely on the shoulders of the young lead, who is just wonderful... really throwing himself into the role, he simply is Mowgli... all the mannerisms and attitude and appearance, just perfect... and given he is the single live action lead in an otherwise computer world... it's stunning to behold and key to making you believe fully and wholeheartedly. Helping the cause is the wonderful voice cast too, with Murray predictably being a true highlight as Baloo, while Walken is simply superb as Louie... a great mix of utter menace with craziness and soul whilst Idris Elba is a utterly terrifying Shere Khan. This terrific pedigree of cast and effects and storytelling blends wonderfully to tell a new take on the story that does the usual beats but adds a realistic sheen to proceedings that is darker but altogether more terrific and rounded... turning this from a classic into even more of a masterclass in family storytelling.... dark at times and thrilling but something oh so very special, and those songs are still there too.... in new forms. This is as perfect a version of

this story as you can get.... a new spin for a new generation, and somehow, somehow... they've managed to make something that may just maybe surpass it's predecessor... now that's something worth swinging about....

Cover with the melted chocolate and leave to set. Cut into 24 bars when cold – or cut into less


