

To qualify for baptism parents should, live within the parish boundaries or **Funerals** regular worshipper St Thomas's/St Luke's. **Parents** and Godparents should also be undertake prepared to baptism preparation classes.

Marriage

You can marry in a C of E church of your choice if certain criteria are shown to be met. For details please contact the vicar.

Every parishioner has the right to a service in church, followed by a committal.



Letter from the Vicar

"In praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' we all commit to playing our part in the renewal of the nations and the transformation of communities." Archbishop Justin Welby



Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement, which invites Christians around the world to pray between Ascension and Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus Christ. What started out as an invitation from the Archbishops' of Canterbury and York in 2016 to the Church of England has grown into an international call to prayer.

The hope from the Archbishops this year is that:

- people will commit to pray with God's world-wide family as a church, individually or as a family;
- churches will hold prayer events, such as 24-7 prayer, prayer stations and prayer walks, across the UK and in other parts of the world;

people will be empowered through prayer by the Holy Spirit, finding new confidence to be witnesses for Jesus Christ.

Churches in Transforming Wigan have made a commitment to pray 24 hours a day for 40 days from Ascension Day. There are many slots at all times of the day that we would value your prayers if you are able.

Let us know if you can help. The last week of the 40 days we are joined by prayer missionaries from South Korea; they are called to pray for the UK, and in this instance for us here in the Wigan Deanery. If God is calling people from across the world to pray for us then we surely are called to join in.



Letter from the Vicar

Our Try Praying initiative complements this call to prayer and in it we have the simple tools to share the strength, the peace and the success of prayer with others. We have given out 5,000 booklets, advertised on buses, placed banners outside churches, our children are involved as we welcome them in church to try out creative prayer stations, families have received packs to assist them to pray together.

Prayer can only happen though if you and I **choose** to speak with God, to **make time** to chat with him, to give thanks, to think of the needs of others – and ourselves. I encourage you to try praying – and to encourage someone else, who in their personal situation you know would value the words 'have you tried praying' and then for them to know that you will pray for them also.

Saturday FM (family meeting) welcomed local families into St Thomas's school for the first time on Saturday 13th May. As part of

the Transforming Wigan initiative which aims to revive the spiritual heart of Wigan, Saturday FM hopes to make a positive difference in our local community by developing a new ways to reach people, create a feeling of belonging, and to share the love of Jesus.

Sunday mornings can be a difficult time for families to attend traditional church services; in today's society we are competing with an array of children's activities such as rugby practice, football tournaments and swimming lessons to name but a few. Saturday mornings are often the same, dance classes, music lessons and gymnastics are all popular children's activities on weekends. And rightly so, these activities are so important for our children's mental and physical wellbeing; our bodies and minds are gifts from God and he wants us to nurture and look after them!

One of the things that Transforming Wigan has taught us during the Saturday FM journey is that as Christians, we need to come out of our churches into our communities and meet people where they are (and this includes *when* they are available) in order to reach them and share the message we have been blessed with. This is how we settled on Saturday afternoons in St Thomas's in the hope that families will be available and feel comfortable in the familiar environment of the school.

In total 23 people attended the first meeting on 13th May. On

the day we had den building led by Jamie, crafts and journal decorating with Kath and Nina and a singing and dancing tutorial by Alex. Sue took care of the technical stuff so we were



also able to enjoy a short and lively film clip based on 2 Kings 6: 15-17, from a series called 'Treasure Hunters' which Dave

Hill of Hilltop kindly donated to us, along with the journals that had been

decorated.

We were even treated to pizza by Jeanette whilst we watched and then talked about the film clip, and Suzanne kept everyone going with refreshments throughout the whole event. It was a jam packed and fun hour with children from pre-schoolers to key stage 2 all finding something to join in with. Dads were dancing and were washing up, mums were crafting and were clearing up at the end which just affirmed the spirit of belonging and community.

Thank you Holy Spirit for being there with us!

Our next event is on Saturday 10th June from 4pm until 5pm at St Thomas's school again. There will be football activities (outside hopefully, weather permitting), a treasure hunt and another singing and dance tutorial from Alex. Food and drinks will be shared and there will even be enough time to squeeze in some more worship! After this the next Saturday FM is on 15th July.





Skitters Farm & Estate, Skitters Grove

Skitters Wood is an ancient woodland. An ancient woodland is defined as a woodland which has existed continuously since 1600 or earlier. Today only 2% of Britain is covered with ancient woodland. There are certain plant species which are indicators of ancient

woodland, one of which is the bluebell. As Ashtonians will know the Skitters Wood has a profusion of bluebells. Skitters Farm was situated in the present day Skitters Grove, off Lowbank Road, Ashton in Makerfield.

The earliest document relating to this area and lands is dated 1653 but the word "Skitters" is

never used. From the mid 17th Century and for most of the 18th Century these lands do not have a specific name and are loosely described in general terms. In 1653 they are described as "parcels of land called the "Two Cowes Heyes" and the "waste" of c4 acres situated in Ashton in Makerfield", and in 1740 as "c12 acres of land, houses, outbuildings, buildings, stables, yards, gardens, orchards, lands, meadows, pasture and common turbary, waters and watercourses, situated in Ashton in Makerfield". Common turbary was a medieval right allowing for the cutting of turf or peat on common land for fuel.

From 1653 - late 18th Century the property changed ownership several times until in 1785 the lands were purchased for £666 by Edward Holt, of Ashton in Makerfield, yeoman. The word "Skitters" first appears in 1785 when Edward Holt gave a name to his lands - he named them Skitters in his Will of 4/5/1785 when he writes "My estate which goes by the name of Skitters I bequeath in equal shares to my 4 sons William, James, Joseph and Edward". This raises the question did Edward Holt name his lands after the existing Skitters Wood or did the wood take its name from the farm after 1785? The

woodland today named Skitters Wood existed a lot earlier than 1785. The wood is an ancient woodland that existed c1600 or earlier so possibly the farm was named after the wood. The meaning of the word Skitters is unclear.

The 4 sons of Edward Holt - William, James, Joseph and Edward held the Skitters Farm and lands until 1814 when Joseph Holt, for £800, sold the farm to his 4 nephews - Thomas, William, James and Edward Holt - the 4 sons of his late brother William. In 1814 Skitters Farm was described as "1 dwelling house, 2 cottages, 2 barns, 2 stables, 2 shippons, 2 orchards, 2 gardens, 12 acres of land consisting of 6 acres of meadow, 6 acres of pasture or common for all the cattle and common right of turbary". The 4 nephews held the property until 1828 when William and James Holt, for £1,670, sold it to Bartholomew Bretherton. Soon after the sale, c1830, William Holt and family sailed to North America where they became some of the earliest colonists in Pennsylvania.

Bartholomew Bretherton was a stagecoach proprietor, of the Hall, Rainhill. He ran the Liverpool - London stagecoach and the Liverpool - Manchester stagecoaches. In 1830 Bartholomew owned 260 acres at Rainhill, which was the first staging point out of Liverpool, where he built stables for 200 horses. Bartholomew's only daughter and heiress, Mary, was engaged to, and in 1829, married William Gerard the brother of Sir John Gerard, of New Hall (Garswood Hall), Ashton in Makerfield. Soon after purchasing the Skitters Farm and lands Bartholomew Bretherton, for £1,800, sold the property to Sir John Gerard of New Hall.

Sir John Gerard gained possession in 1829 of Skitters Farm and estate consisting of "a farmhouse, buildings, a cottage, several closes or parcels of land c12 acres together with all trees and timber thereon and mines thereunder". Sir John Gerard and the Gerards retained ownership of the Skitters Farm and estate leasing the property to tenant farmers. Early in the 20th century Skitters Farm ceased to be a working farm and the acreage was probably taken over by the Home Farm, known locally as Worthingtons Farm, on Liverpool Road.


