

Letter from the Vicar



The events of Remembrance paint clear and inspiring images. The Queen and other members of the royal family attend the Remembrance Day ceremony held at the cenotaph in Whitehall, London. The Field of

Remembrance at Westminster Abbey and the Royal Festival of Remembrance at the Royal Albert Hall. We remember individual people, we remember bravery, we remember those who died. What we remember above all is the selflessness that leads people to extraordinary acts of sacrifice.

This year we have seen the evolving installation of the ceramic poppies around the Tower of London, called 'Blood Swept Lands and

Seas of Red'. This began on 5th August and since then 888,246 ceramic poppies progressively filled the Tower's moat, each poppy representing a British fatality during the First World War. Names from the Roll of Honour were read out daily.



Our own local events are equally important for us as we bring right into our local context the sacrifice of our own - of the members of our families and our friends and neighbours. At the heart of all that was given for us is a love for the local, and what we value, as much as the national and our country's need. As we remember those who grow not old, who paid the ultimate price, they are many amongst the many who also served, worked and enabled; those who were also selfless and sacrificial.

Most, if not all of the Remembrance events include acts of worship and prayer. Self sacrifice for many comes from a love for our fellow human beings - our neighbours, friends and families - that is directed

and guided by the love of God first. When we see God's love in our lives and we are inspired to love as He does, when we understand the selflessness of God in His Son, who also died for us, we understand a God who sacrifices for us.

As we read the words of scripture "greater love hath no man than he lay down his life for us", we may take strength, receive peace and rest in the knowledge of the love of God who knows and who loves us first.

DO YOU REMEMBER...... KENNETH ELISAPANA?

I am sure that many of you do and will be interested to have an update on his life. Some years ago our Church got to know of Kenneth through Margaret Ford who was then our Church Mission Society's Mission Partner, working as secretary to the Bishop at Cairo Cathedral. Kenneth was a young refugee from Southern Sudan who walked to Cairo to escape the violence, in which his father had been murdered and his family scattered. In Cairo he met up with Margaret, who had known him as a young boy when she worked in Southern Sudan. Margaret told us that



his potential had been noted and efforts were being made to obtain a visa for him to study in Kenya. This hw duly did, first at Theological College and then at University, later spending time in America on exchange visits and scholarships. It was there he took his Master's Degree.

Money was needed to fund this educational project and for some years our Church ran an annual mini market, raising over £1000.00 on most occasions. This we forwarded to Margaret's home Church, ST Peter in Eastgate, in Lincoln, who also raised money and administered the fund.

Some of you will remember Kenneth and Margaret coming to visit our Church, then Kenneth was interviewed by our then curate Bill Forster, and we all shared a Faith Supper

Kenneth married a Kenyan girl named Judy and they now live in Chicago with their two daughters aged 7 and 4. Kenneth is a civil servant and was recently promoted to an Executive position in the Department on aging, handling health, legal, financial and social challenges facing senior citizens in the state of Illinois, which Kenneth says is a really fulfilling job.

However Kenneth has never forgotten that the ultimate aim of all his education was that he should do something to help his people in the Southern Sudan. He is now the founder and executive director of a humanitarian project there called VOICES OF HOPE. In a recent newsletter Kenneth has sent me he spells out the mission of VOICES OF HOPE as being committed to empowering the people of Southern Sudan to live self sufficient lives by providing humanitarian support through partnership with local and regional organisations, implementation for sustainable health and agricultural and vocational projects.

Kenneth hopes to make another visit to South Sudan towards the end of this year. I hope this account reinforces our belief in Kenneth and makes all the hard work we

put into our Mini Markets seem worthwhile.





The Boxtrolls (PG) Directed by Graham Annabele and Anthony Stacchi

Stars the Voices of: Isaac Hempstead-Wright, Elle Fanning, Sir Ben Kingsley, Jared Harris, Richard Ayoade, Nick Frost, Simon Pegg, Tracey Morgan, Toni Collette, and Dee Bradley Baker

In a Nutshell: It's great when something or someone keeps firing consistently on all cylinders, whether it's Christopher Nolan or in this case, the animation studio LAIKA responsbile for Coraline, Paranoman and now this animated treat.... talk about a good record. As with it's predecessors, this animated romp mixes the hilariously silly with the wonderful ghoulish, straying that fine line with aplomb in a way that will thrills kids and adults alike, and scare away those not quite ready for what it has to offer. With a terrific cast of fruity fun voices, special mention to Kingsley who is simply wonderfully evil as the villainous and gruesome Snatcher and the always wonderful Richard Ayoade, not to mention Pegg and Frost in seperate roles and a fantastically clueless Jared Harris, which is always welcome as well as great young leads too. The animation as can be expected from LAIKA, is extraordinary in it's detail and wonderful cleverness as can be expected with stop motion. Revolting, creative, funny, clever and wonderful from start to finish... this is a true family treat for those who like their movies funny, crazy and outrageous! Rating: 10/10


COVENTRY'S CROSS

The people of Coventry will always remember the dreadfully long night of 14th November 1940. It was the longest air raid of the World War II and when the light dawned the next morning, Coventry was in ruins. So many people were dead, injured or homeless; there wasn't a person who had not suffered during that night.

The medieval cathedral was a burnt out shell. Two of the burnt roof beams were tied together to make a cross and this makeshift symbol was set up where the altar had been. A cross was also made from the 14th century iron nails that had held the roof together and this Cross of Nails still remains today as a symbol of sympathy. forgiveness reconciliation. Copies of the Cross of Nails have been presented to countries round the globe as a reminder that love and understanding bind us together and that we need to remember the horrors that happen when people forget that.


