Cookson's Farm, Ashton Heath

Ashtonians may remember Cookson's Farm which until the 1970's was situated on Ashton Heath at the junction with present day Lincoln Drive. In the 17th century Ashton Heath would have been a guiet, secluded part of Ashton in Makerfield. Roger Lowe, a shopkeeper in Ashton and a follower of the puritan religion, often mentions Ashton Heath in his diary(1663 - 1678) because he went to Ashton Heath to pray - "April 6 Monday 1663, I was in a troubled condition in my mind considering my unsettledness and that god was highly offended with me therefore I went into Ashton Heaths and kneeled me down in a ditch and made my pray unto the lord". At the time that Roger Lowe was writing the farm that later became known as Cookson's Farm would have existed. The farmlands are mentioned in the 1630's and there was probably a very early farmhouse on Ashton Heath. It would be 43 years later that a 3 storey farmhouse with a datestone "1706 RE" was built. RE probably refers to the builder of the farmhouse but the name is unknown. This farmhouse later to be called Cookson's Farm existed until its demolition in the 1970's. The farmhouse existed long before the 3 Cookson brothers, Joseph, John and Richard, shoemakers in Ashton in Makerfield, bought the farm in 1780 for £900. Each of the brothers owned a 1/3 share of the farm. The Cookson family owned the farm for 67 years, from 1780 - 1847, and thereafter it retained the name Cookson's Farm. The farmlands purchased by the 3 Cookson brothers included lands adjacent to Ashton Heath called the 3 Heath Fields, lands opposite the "Eagle & Child" pub and extending to todays Lincoln Drive, lands now beneath Lincoln Drive estate and beyond Millingford Brook towards the former Edge Green sewage works, lands near Duke Street, off Princess Road, and lands along Mill Street between the "Eagle & Child" and the end of Princess Road. Along Mill Street was a field called the Damstead taking its name from the dam on Millingford Brook which created a millpond to drive the waterwheel of Ashton corn mill. The former "Millstone Inn" was named after the nearby mill. In 1798 Richard Cookson begueathed his 1/3 share in the farm to his nephew John Cookson, son of his late brother William. In 1800 Joseph Cookson, and in 1801 John Cookson, each bequeathed their 1/3 share in the farm to their sister Betty Brimelow. When Betty died in 1811 she bequeathed her 2/3 share in the farm to her nephew John Cookson who became the

sole owner of Cookson's Farm. In 1815 John Cookson married Margaret Banks of Golborne. They farmed at Cookson's Farm assisted by farm labourer Thomas Boardman and family. John died in 1847 aged 88 and bequeathed the farm to John Shaw, of Maghull, the son of his late cousin. Thomas Boardman continued farming at Cookson's Farm. In 1848 John Shaw offered Cookson's Farm as security on a mortgage of £1,050. 1851 John Shaw died bequeathing the farm to Thomas Boardman.

In 1851, to repay the mortgage money, Cookson's Farm was auctioned at the "Gerard Arms" (today B&M shop), Gerard Street, Ashton. The farm and all the lands, except the 3 Heath Fields, were purchased for £1,260 by Robert Ellison, farmer, of Windy Arbour Farm, Winstanley. The 3 Heath Fields were purchased for £755 by Nathaniel Littler, of Ashton under Lyne, draper. After the auction Nathaniel sold the 3 Heath Fields to Sir John Gerard, of New Hall/Garswood Hall, Ashton for £785. Nathaniel Littler was born in Ashton and his grave is the large steeple memorial near the vestry door, St. Thomas', Ashton. Robert Ellison, owner of Cookson's Farm, died in 1879 and bequeathed the farm to his nephew Jonathan Simpkin. innkeeper, "Golden Lion", Gerard Street, Ashton. Jonathan was farming at Cookson's Farm in the 1890's but he may have sold the farmhouse c1880 to John Hill who owned a hinge making business in Ashton. John Hill was living at Ashton Heath in 1881 (possibly Cookson's Farm) and in 1891 is listed as living at Coökson's Farm. Jonathan died 1898 in Bournemouth and John Hill may then have purchased the farmland since he is listed as farmer at Cookson's Farm c1901 - c1914. 1915 Isaac Plunkett, brother of George Plunkett landlord of the "Eagle & Child", owned Cookson's Farm. c1920 -1959 Fred and Frances Hope owned Cookson's Farm. 1960 -1970's Mark Williams butchers owned Cookson's Farm and used it as a piggery, 1970's Cookson's Farm was demolished and the land sold for the building of Lincoln Drive estate.

In a Nutshell: What happens when there is a certain property that is an established classic for one reason or another, but technically it has never been properly adapted... yes, there's that one version but that was never an actual film regardless of how iconic it became, and to be fair beyond the one element was never that good even if it's still a classic of sorts. So when it comes to doing a new version, what do you do? People will always be wary of touching a classic property even if it actually needs doing Well bravo because this is now the definitive work to be fair, yes Tim Curry as Pennywise will never not be iconic, but adapting the story properly always needing doing and this is just terrific from start to finish. It's terrifying when it needs to be, but essentially sticks to in the end what the story needs to be, an adventure romp with an iconic group of friends who come up against the odds and team together to take it on. Taking its cue from the 1980s classic such as The Goonies, Monster Squad and Stand by Me.... this is less a blood curdling horror flick and more a monster romp for teenagers to grow up with like those perennial classics did for us, and the main thing it does spot on which it needed to do is in the teenager characters themselves, all of whom turn in fantastically funny and brilliant performances and instantly within seconds make you care and feel for them and bond instantly. Any charges of not being scary enough really doesn't matter, because to me that's not what this is... it's an adventure thrill ride and that it does in spades, it's creepy as anything when it needs to be but then focuses on the relationships between these friends and each one with their surroundings and fears in a brilliant way that ensures that this movie will go on in the memory and fondness like those 80s classics did, helped by its 80s setting naturally. I'm not going to single out a child performance because they're all so brilliant individually, but what of Pennywise the dancing clown? Well, he's absolutely creepy and terrifying as he needs to be, granted he's not as hilarious as Tim Curry's rendition... but then again is that a bad thing? He's effectively creepy and physical and has humor when needed but overall is just a terrific performance and something you'll struggle to shake. This has rightfully proved a huge hit, I think down to the fact it does everything perfectly... it balances thrills and chills so it can appeal to everyone and still do exactly what it needs to do... it floats and you will too. In a Nutshell: When can you forgive a seguel that is a massive letdown, when you loved the first movie so much and then the follow up does everything wrong nearly? Yes there's moments that are fun, but overall the lasting impression is of a much lesser product that makes no sense, has no logic you can switch your brain off for and just sits there lazily feeling like not enough people cared about it as much to really put a heap of effort in.... well having a insane cameo performance that won't stop and having robot dogs does always help. 2015's Kingsman was an utter delight, another jewel in the crown of Matthew Vaughns' directing palette (2010's classic superhero satire featuring Hit Girl, Stardust, Layer Cake and X-Men First Class: the best X-men movie to date)... it had one or two moments that are a bit out there but overall it really worked, had solid characters and a really solid story that really engaged and did things... a follow up really should capitalize on that. What this does is replace Sam Jacksons' iconic villain (who had cool little quirks and a genius master plan) with Julianne Moore's smirking villain (who has not enough back-story bar a barely explained love for retro things) and a rubbish plan that isn't well explained and while it has some neat political satire, goes nowhere really.... A certain main character returns for not well explained a reason and looks like they don't want to be there frankly which is a shame because the character and the actor are great and while it still works enough, it's very very lazy! There are a lot of new additions from big stars who are barely in it and don't really do much, just Jeff Bridges face is great enough but it's nice to give them something to do. This review may wind up too long soon, but yeah it's a huge huge disappointment.... But that I've still got goodwill is down to characters and actors like Mark Strong and Taron Egerton who are still terrific, that bonkers cameo running gag and some pretty cool action sequences still... it's fun but for anyone who really loved the first, maybe you'll have fun but if you want something more then you'll need to just watch the first again.... Manners may maketh man, but so does competent moviemaking and sadly they seem to have forgotten this on this go round, hopefully the inevitable trilogy closer will make things great again.
