The picnic and praise in the park was a great example of churches working together, a wonderful afternoon, and what an example of our and God's love to the community.


May we go forward strength to strength, building up more disciples to show God's workings in all we do at St. Luke's and throughout our hub.

Duke of Edinburgh Award Centre

We have had another successful year in our Duke of Edinburgh Group at St Thomas' and St Luke's. This year we have run a Bronze Group with 11 participants. All have completed the award this year. The practice expedition took place in Rivington and the assessed expedition in Parbold.

We have also had 4 young people participate in the Silver award and undertaken their expedition in the Garstang area and are now preparing their presentation to complete this section.

We have seen the young people develop new skills and work as part of a team over the last nine months to overcome challenges together.

We are starting a new groups for Duke of Edinburgh Award in September at Bronze and Silver levels with the programme normally lasts about 9 and 12 months respectively.

We invite young people starting in year 10 and above in September 2017 to come and join us in participating in the Duke of Edinburgh - Bronze Award.

The award comprises of 4 sections:

Physical Activity Volunteering Skills

Expedition - which comprises an overnight camping experience at Bronze and two nights at Silver.

The programme requires that participants show commitment over the 9 -12 months in order to achieve the award.

Improves decision making ability

Opportunity to try new experiences

HELP IS NEEDED

For many who may be unaware the Boys Brigade at St Thomas's Church has been in active existence since it was founded over 50 years ago.

This uniformed organisation was founded in 1883 in Glasgow by Sir William Alexander Smith and its values are based on the twin pillars of "The advancement of Christ's kingdom amongst boys and Discipline"-values we believe that are as strong today as they were when the Boys Brigade was founded.

Over many years we have seen many boys come to a faith in Jesus at St Thomas's through the work and commitment of many officers – and we need that to continue.

SO HELP IS NEEDED.

We meet every Tuesday evening during term time and our age groups range form 5-18- consisting of Anchor Boys, Junior Section, Company Section and Senior Section.

We have many other activities that we do as well as giving boys grounding in the Christian Faith.

SO HELP IS NEEDED

We need help in all three sections but especially within the Junior and Company Section.

Once a week, once a month, we need volunteers to come along and help out that is what is needed

IF WE DON'T GET HELP

I do not ask for officers/helpers lightly, but it has come to a point that if we do not get some help then sadly we will be unable to continue as a functioning Boys Brigade Company here at St Thomas.

<u>Part Two</u> 1770 - 1930

In 1771 Legh Master, the younger, due to financial problems, sold New Hall (later named Garswood Hall) estate to the Gerard family. However, the Master family excluded the Birchenhead from the sale. In 1808 Rev. Legh Hoskins Master, son of the late Legh Master, the younger, sold the Birchenhead, reserving the coal mining rights for himself, to James Ashton, of Billinge, farmer. In 1815 James' daughter Ellen Ashton married James Melling, of Ashton. farmer. In 1835 James Ashton died. He placed his estate in Trust to Rev. Edmund Sibson, vicar of St. Thomas', Ashton, to sell at auction and the proceeds to be given to James' two daughters Mary and Ellen. The estate was auctioned at the "Fleece", Ashton, and James' son in law James Melling purchased the Birchenhead excluding the mining rights which were reserved for Charles Legh Hoskins Master, son of the late Rev. Legh Hoskins Master.

In 1847 James Melling sold the Birchenhead, excluding the mining rights, to Sir John Gerard, of New Hall, Ashton in Makerfield. Sir John only purchased the surface lands not the coal beneath the ground. In 1874 Rev. Charles Hoskins Master, son of the late Rev. Charles Legh Hoskins Master sold the coal mining rights at Birchenhead to Thomas Melling, grocer, of Ashton in Makerfield, son of the previous James Melling.

Thomas Melling and his wife Ellen lived at Townfield Gate, part of todays Liverpool Road, near the former St. Oswalds RC primary school and owned a grocers shop at 2 & 4 Liverpool Road, opposite the "Kings Arms". Thomas

was also a churchwarden at St. Thomas' church, the Overseer of the Poor in charge of the township poor and the registrar of births, marriages and deaths for Ashton. Thomas' brother, William Melling, was the proprietor of the "Kings Arms Hotel", Ashton. Thomas died 1876 but the grocery and colliery business continued under his name and managed by his widow Ellen Melling and son Alan Ashton Boothby Melling.



In 1889 Thomas Henry Stone, a mining engineer, of Standishgate, Wigan, became a partner in Birchenhead Colliery and the colliery was expanded under the name of "Melling & Stone". Two new shafts were sunk 300 yards to

mine the Orrell coal seam. Mrs. Ellen Melling cut the first sod of one shaft and Mrs. Mary Jane Stone the first sod of the other shaft. Success to the enterprise was toasted with a bumper of champagne and a barrel of beer with work suspended for the day. On Saturday all the employees, about 60 in number, attended a dinner at the "Robin Hood", Ashton, with singing and dancing.

In 1892 Ellen Melling and her son Alan Ashton Boothby Melling resigned from the partnership at the colliery. Ellen was now living at Belmont Villas which still exist, the first houses to be built on Wigan Road in 1890, midway between Osborne Road and Cansfield Road. James Birkett Almond, of Standish, joined Thomas Henry Stone as a co-partner in Birchenhead colliery under the name "Almond & Stone". James was a butcher in Standish but in the 1870's he established the "J.B. Almond Brewery" in Standish. He became very wealthy and lived at 3 High Street, Standish, "The Beeches", which until recently was an hotel and restaurant.

The Birchenhead colliery came to be known locally as "Almonds Pit", probably after the death of Thomas H. Stone in 1896 and also to distinguish it from the nearby "Park Colliery of J & R Stone" known locally as "Stones'". Ashtonians will recall that on Lowbank Road, before the building of the M6 in the early 1960's, there was a steep incline up to Spindle Hillock known as Almonds Brew taking its name from the nearby pit. After the death of Thomas H. Stone in 1896 the colliery continued under the sole ownership of James B. Almond. The pit was closed in 1896 but reopened in 1900 when James B. Almond erected new head gear. James B. Almond died in 1908 and Birchenhead colliery continued under the ownership of the Almond family until closure about 1930. The colliery never employing more than 60 men and only 33 in 1929. Birchenhead colliery was a very small mine in comparison to the nearby J & R Stone's Park Nos. 1, 2 & 3 Collieries, Liverpool Road, Ashton in Makerfield, which in 1923 employed 984 men and in 1933 1,292 men.





Gabriel is best known for his appearing to a young Jewish girl named Mary to tell her that she will give birth to Jesus.






Spider-Man: Homecoming (12A)

In a Nutshell: By this point in the whole movie watching game, surely the idea of yet another Spider-Man movie had us filled with doubt thinking why and why bother? From the original trilogy through to the more recent two movies, the franchise has had it's day and a mix of success and treading water, what could ever make it fresh enough to give it another go? Oh, how about letting the actual studio do it justice. Yep, while the Marvel logo has been prevalent through the series, they never truly had the rights to tell the story their way and incorporate the larger universe into the story... till now, and it goes a long way. Firstly, after introducing the character again in Civil War without the need for his origin story (because we all know it by now) we can jump right in with the character and just have fun, no back story and no constant clichés and speeches.... plus Peter finally feels like the right age and the perfect actor to play that too without having a good actor feel too old to play the character in high school. Plus it fits perfectly as a high school movie, doing all the things one of those does with aplomb. It has a terrific villain in Keatons' Vulture, his motivation and story means that you understand him and pity him while also willing Spidey on against him and the way it incorporates the MCU into this plot strand is perfect along with one more perfect twist. You have the Downey and Favreau roles, both brilliant as ever with a lot more Happy Hogan this time around which is brilliant in this case as he is awesomely used. And naturally, the action is awesome and the effects are great as well as the zingers... basically everything you want from a Spidey movie is here and more, it's so much fun and it's high time they really nailed the format and yet again Marvel studios proves why it's the best... brilliant and a treat for all ages, go web go!

In a Nutshell: Is there anything Christopher Nolan can't do? There certainly wasn't any trepidation towards this movie from the get go, everyone basically guessed it would be a win immediately and so it has proved once more. Taking his used idea of the different timelines for the same event that assumes we'll keep up with each story, this breaks into

telling the story of those on the boat going to save soldiers plus those in the air, on the ships and on the land too in many dramatic and devastating ways. The way it's been filmed with the IMAX cameras and the large format is astonishing, and deserves to be seen on the biggest screen possible in the best projection you can find... this is a cinema movie! Nolan once more mastering the craft of moviemaker in so many ways.... heed marshals terrific performances from his many actors, no one performer taking a lead role and all being very collaborative, though special mentions to Styles for impressing majorly in his first role and to Hardy for expressing so much through just the eyes plus a turn from Murphy that is going to stir conversation about what is right and wrong. Big on scale and big on emotion, this is a timely reminder of just what you can do with a big summer movie when done right... not shrimping on scale and spectacle but remembering the message it's meaning to convey in a heartfelt way too, a grand mix of emotion and scale. Yet another easy reminder of why these guys are the best at what they do, believe the Nolan hype once more. But most importantly this is a devastating reminder of what we had to sacrifice for the freedoms we have today and will make you thankful that firstly you were not around during such dark days but mostly thankful to those who endured this so that we would no longer have to, and for that it's a majorly important piece of history.
